Litter Prevention and Community Beautification

Litter in the right-of-way is a big problem in Nashville. The Nashville Department of Transportation and Multimodal Infrastructure (NDOT) and Metro Beautification and Environment Commission (MBEC) are committed to resolving the litter issues residents are experiencing in their communities by deploying NDOT maintenance crews and court ordered community service crews to problem areas identified through hubNashville reports. NDOT staff also work to educate the Nashville community about how to prevent litter and keep streets, sidewalks, bikeways, waterways, and all right-of-way clean.

NDOT's maintenance crews regularly collect litter and clean illegal dumping sites in the Metro right-of-way across the county. So far this year crews have collected **413.3 tons of litter over 1019.31 lane miles**. In the month of March, crews collected 127.47 tons of litter over 352.51 lane miles. Residents are encouraged to report litter issues through hubNashville online at hub.Nashville.gov (24/7), via the hubNashville mobile app (24/7), or by calling 311 (Monday through Friday 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.). Year-to-date NDOT has received 659 litter reports and 1,114 illegal dumping reports through hubNashville. In March, NDOT received 186 litter reports and 438 illegal dumping reports. These reports allow the department to identify problem areas and deploy staff appropriately.

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2022 Mayor's Spring Clean:

The Mayor's Spring Clean is scheduled for **Saturday, April 23**. This date coincides with the [Keep America Beautiful - Great American Cleanup](http://KeepAmericaBeautiful.org) event which runs from March 21 through June 22. Nashville is proud to be an affiliate of Keep America Beautiful Inc. Currently, NDOT has 10 cleanup events scheduled for the Mayor's Spring Clean event on April 23. The department has set a goal to have at least 1 cleanup in each Metro Council district by the end of the Great American Cleanup event on June 22.

In addition to NDOT's internal maintenance crews, residents are encouraged to become an Adopt-A-Street partner or register a volunteer neighborhood cleanup.

Neighborhood Cleanups: NDOT and MBEC also facilitate neighborhood clean-ups year-round. Residents can register their neighborhood clean-up online at StopLitter.Nashville.gov and NDOT/MBEC will provide free supplies (bags, gloves, vests, etc.) to the organizer. In the month of March, there were 34 volunteer cleanups conducted, with 475 volunteers, logging 1,460 hours. These cleanups resulted in over 14 tons of debris and litter collected off Nashville's streets.

Adopt-A-Street Program: The Adopt-A-Street program is a great way that faith communities, businesses, neighborhood groups, families, and individuals can help keep Nashville beautiful. It provides a way to show pride in your community! There are currently 88 active Adopt-A-Street partners in the program. NDOT plans to continue to promote and grow this program. Residents can apply to become an Adopt-A-Street partner online at AdoptAStreet.Nashville.gov. In March, Adopt-A-Street partners conducted 21 cleanups to help keep Nashville beautiful and clean.

Work accomplished 4/1/22 – 4/7/22:

- PRI continued concrete work on Monroe St at 9th Ave N and at Arthur St. – see pictures below of excavated areas for islands and bus stop pad, islands filled with topsoil, and islands with form work for curbs.
- Marking Impressions continued permanent thermoplastic detail marking installation.
- PRI began installation of bike symbols with arrows on green background.
- Vulcan began sign installation.

Two-Week look ahead as weather allows:

- PRI to continue concrete work on Monroe St at 9th Ave N and Arthur Ave.
- PRI to continue installation of bike symbols with arrows on green background.

Madison Station Blvd Project

Traffic Calming

[Metro Neighborhood Traffic Calming Program](#)

Demand for the Traffic Calming program, with over 200 applications, currently outpaces our available resources requiring NDOT to prioritize projects. Neighborhoods are prioritized based on crash history (40%), measured speeds (30), and neighborhood characteristics (30%).

Once a neighborhood is selected, NDOT staff will meet with the neighborhood to give an overview of the traffic calming toolbox, share the data that has been collected, and kick-off the design process. Once a design is finalized, neighbors will be asked to approve the project through a petition with 70% of homeowners in agreement. The construction phase will begin as soon as the completed petition is received.

We are currently collecting data on all new applicants since July 2020 and moving quickly with the 25 projects selected in the fall. In addition, [NDOT selected 25 more projects last winter](#) which will begin with community meetings in the spring/early summer.

Paving

Notice of milling and paving on a Metro roadway is required to be handled by the contractor via door hanger or mailing prior to the commencement of the project. Additional notification is required to be presented to the homeowner if a construction sign is going to be placed on their property. Report any violations directly to [hubNashville](#).

- [2022 Spring Paving Projects](#) - These projects were funded in 2021 and will be completed this spring before we begin work on the Summer 2022 Paving Projects.
- [2022 Summer Paving Projects](#) - Summer 2022 paving is expected to begin in late March/early April, weather dependent.

NOTE: All paving projects are weather dependent.

| Casting Adjustments | Adjustment (lowering) of utilities to allow milling machines to traverse the roadway without damaging utility assets. Re-adjustment (raising) of utilities so that they will again be flush with the new surface that will be applied. |
| Milling/Undercutting | Removal (milling) of old surface using a milling machine. All milled surfaces must be cleaned by the milling contractor and marked appropriately to safely direct traffic. During undercutting the old surface that has failed is cut out and new material is put back in before it is resurfaced. |
| Infrared | A technique where infrared heating systems apply heat to pavement surfaces and aid in the removal of existing material and replacement with new asphalt mixture. |
| Signal Loop Wires | Signal Loop Wires are installed under the pavement. They are used to detect vehicles passing or arriving at a traffic light. |
| Crack Seal | A sealant put into the construction joint to keep water out so the road will not depreciate. |
| Fog Seal | A sealing put on the road to give the road an extended period before it gets paved. |
