The timeframe to spend the funding is September 2022.</li> <li>▶ Sustainability planning: Currently we receive up to 18 Section 8 vouchers per month; 100 Mainstream Vouchers designated for individuals with disabilities; and 198 Section 8 vouchers designated for individuals experiencing homelessness – provided through the American Rescue Plan.</li> <li>Push for 500 landlords who will accept vouchers. There is a newly created landlord mitigation fund to provide incentive for landlords and additional funding is being requested to create a sign-up bonus fund.</li> <li>▶ An Outreach Coordination meeting was held yesterday with all of the outreach organizations to map where services are currently provided, which areas are being missed, and begin discussing how the organizations can spread their services. Regular follow up meetings will be conducted to improve coordination and communication.</li> <li>▶ The Permanent Supportive Housing Development that has been slated to be built on 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave in partnership with MDHA is now moving forward.
