X. REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR

Monique Horton Odom, Director

Ms. Odom announced:

- The staff met with the mayor's office finance department to discuss the current state of the department and FY22 funding requests. We are in need of operating funds. We will know in the next few weeks what will be included in the mayor's recommended budget.
- The Hermitage Capitol Corridor has recommended to delay the reopening of Church Street Park until May or June. Ms. Odom stated that Civic Design is preparing a preliminary proposal and timeline. We will move forward with stakeholder input after that information is received. It should be parallel to the reopening of the park.
- We are preparing for seasonal activities. Currently we have been in reactive mode with cleanup efforts after the most recent storms. Special thanks to the consolidated maintenance division and other Park's teammates who responded to the call for cleanup efforts internally and with our peer departments.
- The electronic meeting order will expire on April 28, unless another one is issued the May board meeting will be in person.
