This email is an appeal for you to reconsider aspects of a requested zoning change that would allow Park Place Subdivision in Antioch, TN to become a connector neighborhood. The Oliveri Property is in the stages for development as a new subdivision adjacent to mine. I understand that a connector road would be created from the Oliveri Property to Park Place. While I have no qualms with the subdivision itself, I am not in favor of Park Place becoming a connector neighborhood.

Becoming a connector neighborhood would expose our small community to all sorts of unseemly problems. Increased traffic would undermine the neighbors in this community ability to safely walk pets and children, exercise, ride bikes, go to the mailboxes. Increased numbers of people who are not a part of the neighborhood means that the neighbors will deal with trash in the yards and on the streets, the possibility of more break-ins, increased noise pollution, and inability to safely sit outside of our homes as well as perform other activities about our homes. I can foresee more vehicular accidents in the neighborhood associated with neighbors stopping to turn in the driveways or backing out while visitors from the increased traffic to the neighborhood unconsciously speed down our streets.

Other collateral damage includes changes in the stature of the neighborhood whereby respectable people move out of the neighborhood and unwholesome people move in. This would not only negatively impact Park Place Subdivision but the new subdivision on the Oliveri Property because unwholesome practices tend to expand and gravitate.

If the plan is to increase the number of connector neighborhoods in District 33 for new development, Park Place Subdivision should be left intact. It is a small community with a large number of elderly neighbors who take pride in their neighborhood.
