#### VIII. NEW BUSINESS

10-21-02 Staff requests approval to enter into a Purchase Option Agreement and ultimately to purchase, 3 contiguous parcels of property comprising a total of 9.55 acres in Metro Council District 30 for future park development. The parcels include: Parcel # 16200030400, located at 140 Tusculum Rd; Parcel # 16200030500 located at 5073 McLendon Drive and Parcel # 16200030600 located at 279 Bart Drive.

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### VIII. NEW BUSINESS (con't)

- 10-21-03 Metro Parks is requesting approval of a *revised* Agreement for Grant of Easement for a Conservation Greenway between Germantown JV, LLC and Metro Government, on property owned by Germantown JV, LLC located at 1420 Adams Street, Parcel # 0820501770.
- 10-21-04 Request for approval to declare 0.369 acres on a portion of Orchard Bend Park to be public right of way to construct road improvements at the intersection of Blue Hole Road and Pettus Road and to create a new entrance road into Orchard Bend Park. The Nashville Department of Transportation will be managing the construction of these improvements and will maintain the improvements within the public right of way.
- Mr. Brandon Dyce, Board Chair of Friends of Metro Animal Care and Control, requests board approval to fundraise during the Pickle Paw Classic. This Pickleball Tournament will be hosted at Centennial Sportsplex on October 23-24, 2021.
- 10-21-06 West Nashville Sports League/Miracle League of Music City requests an Amendment to 02-17-09 Board Approves Request of Scott Tygard to Solicit Sponsorships to Design and Construct a Miracle Field in Warner Park. The proposed amendment would rescind the demolition of The Heriges field and amend the 2005 Warner Park Master Plan that limits the number of fields in Warner Park. The proposed amendment would allow the existing five baseball fields to remain with a new special needs Miracle Field and an ADA playground.
- **10-21-07** Ms. Jenny Hannon, President of Friends of Warner Parks, request to address the Board regarding the Miracle Field.
- **10-21-08** Nashville Zoo at Grassmere requests board approval for a permanent beer permit to allow the sale of beer at the Zoo.
- Mr. Darrell Hawks, Executive Director of Friends of Mill Ridge Park, requests the board to approve an amendment to the Friends of Mill Ridge Park-Trailhead 2021 grant. This amendment changes the grant from a cash contribution by Friends of Mill Ridge Park to an in-kind contribution for construction of a primitive trailhead at Mill Ridge Park. The value of the in-kind contribution is \$40,000. Metro Parks has agreed to commit up to \$50,000 to the project. No money will be paid to Metro Parks.
- **10-21-10** Mr. Steven Illgen, President-Elect of the Friends of Two Rivers Mansion, requests board approval to fundraise to support the maintenance and repair work at Two Rivers Mansion.
