- 1. Call to order and welcome Chairman Paul Summers
- 2. Invocation
- 3. Pledge of allegiance
- 4. Approval of agenda Gamble moved/Avilla seconded carried
- 5. Approval of minutes of July 2021 meeting Gamble moved/Martinez seconded carried
- 6. Welcome and introduction of guests Chairman Summers
- 7. Reports from the leadership of various committee/working groups
 - Commissioner Martinez working to secure letters to be sent to the agencies requesting AAR's
 - Commissioner Oliver created spreadsheet to organize the response public/private, investigation, timeline; 37 entities with 15 who have submitted AAR's; some entities overlap, so working now to reduce redundancy; will make recommendations about which agencies to request information.
- 8. Introduction by Secretary Quin of the TBI Director, Fusion Center and staff
- 9. Presentation by the TBI and Fusion Center

Report to the commission by TBI Director Rausch –

- Initial response began once TBI was notified; SAC over TBI Criminal Intelligence Unit responded to the scene to determine needs;
- K9 responded to the scene from TBI Fire Division;
- As day unfolded, team began to engage as the Fusion Center, Intelligence Analyst provided intelligence information;
- TBI Criminal Investigative Division assisted on the scene;
- Director Rausch spoke with the FBI and they advised they would take the lead on the investigation;
- Air assets were deployed to obtain early aerial photography of the scene;
- As the day progressed, a more coordinated effort to determine investigative needs was undertaken;
- TBI personnel helped to determine the identity of the RV;
 - TBI Special Agent Forensic Scientists deployed to attempt techniques to reveal numbers and identification;
- End of day one, discussions were had between TBI and FBI TBI advised they could identify DNA samples within 8 hours of collection;
- TBI SA Forensic Scientists collected tissue samples at the scene to determine a confirmative match – information provided to FBI;
- Once identification was made, personnel conducted a deep dive into the background of the responsible party no one had this individual on the radar;
- FBI also confirmed familial DNA identity of the bomber was released.
- The TBI Criminal Intelligence Unit worked closely with the FBI to sort evidence;
- TBI Special Agents participated in team interviews;
- On communications with leadership, briefings, Director stated it was a very impressive example of an information sharing event between partner agencies.

AD Richard Littlehale:

- TBI and state Homeland Security worked together;
- TBI responds to requests for support and assistance; other unit Technical Services Unit engaged to process electronic evidence and investigative efforts;
- The FBI's Joint Terrorism Task Force (JTTF) and the Violent Crimes Task Force (VCTF) specialist agents were in the center of the investigation; laid the groundwork for the excellent collaboration that occurred.

SAC Alicia Rutherford:

• The Tennessee Fusion Center created in the wake of 911 to enhance communication between law enforcement agencies;

- TFC is one of 80 centers in the US only one that is co-directed by TBI and Homeland Security – prevent and respond to criminal activity;
- TFC is an "all crimes" center;
- TBI side provides criminal investigative assistance, AMBER Alert/BLUE Alert, Sex Offender Registry (SOR)

10. Questions and Answers

Q&A:

- Chairman Summers asked the Director to qualify the communication between agencies: Director rated it a "10" on a scale of 1-10. Chairman asked about the timeframe of the investigative response.
 - Director advised that 32-40 hours in they knew they were on the right track and felt like they knew what happened; at that point, efforts turned to determining whether any other co-conspirators were involved. It really was "a couple of months" before they could definitively say that the responsible party acted alone.
 - The RV was very full and it took quite a while to determine the type of bomb many different types of bomb components in the RV.
 - FBI's behavioral team was on scene to analyze evidence and information aided in the analysis of evidence.
 - DNA gave them the opportunity to focus the investigation never know the real intent because the "actor" is gone.
- Chairman asked for the motive.
 - Director advised that the actor had a fixation on "lizard people" who would come to earth, go through the AT&T switching system to become human and take over the earth.
- Captain Oliver asked for AAR from TBI.
 - Director Rausch advised they are an investigative support agency and because that is their natural role, they do not have a formal AAR;
 - TBI's information is included in the FBI's AAR and timeline;
- Captain Oliver asked about lessons learned.
 - Director Rausch advised that relationships and communication were critical;
 - Many new leaders at MNPD, ATF and FBI, but had already engaged and had begun meetings to develop relationships;
 - Director said they met at the command post and teams saw that the leaders had relationships and that trickled down and set the tone for the interaction;
 - Director Rausch stressed the importance of leadership interactions;
 - Largest challenge is always communication;

- Hampered by the physical structure learned lessons around diversity of resources, telephone communications were challenging with the loss of the AT& facility;
- Utilize other forms of communications; other platforms and networks;
- Previous efforts to hone in on one type of platform revealed the need for diversification of resources.
- CM Gamble asked about the development of drone assets.
 - Director Rausch stated there was great advantage to utilizing drone capabilities and have since replaced their drones and the asset is up and running;
 - FBI had a team that was collecting evidence and watched how the FBI collected and put together the evidence;
- Secretary Quin asked for additional information on drones:
 - Director stated they learned about diversity in your technology;
 - Need to know where the single points of failure exist; talking with AT&T about putting in place protections for infrastructure;
 - AD Littlehale: discussion about load bearing infrastructure.
- Brenda Sanderson asked about the investigation into the individual and why TBI/Fusion Center didn't know.
 - Director Rausch stated they weren't provided the information, and MNPD didn't ask for assistance or any kind of work up on this individual;
 - o Fusion Center had no information on this individual even had they been asked
