- **11-21-02** Mr. Charlie Warfield, representative for Heriges family, requests to address the Board regarding the Heriges Field.
- 11-21-03 Ms. Michelle Johnson, Secretary of the Board for Miracle League of Music City and Parks liaison for the Miracle Field project, requests to address the Board regarding the Miracle Field.
- 11-21-04 Request for conditional approval to accept a donation from Habitat for Humanity, of 2 tracts of land totaling 1.47-acres and proposed park improvements to the land. Tract One is a 1.14-acre portion of Parcel ID# 06000005700 located at 3017 Aldrich Lane. Tract Two is a 0.33-acre portion of Parcel ID# 06000008900 located at 520 Brick Church Park Drive. Conditions include:
  - Parks staff-level approval of all design, construction and compliance with all Metro Parks standards and policies
  - Coordinated public engagement during design phase
  - A Phase One environmental review of all property to be donated and resolution of any required remediation
  - Development of property survey, legal description and all other instruments required per Metro to accept the property donation
  - Standard written confirmation of other terms including no match obligation from
  - Upon transfer, Metro Parks will operate and maintain the park.
- 11-21-05 A lease amendment is requested for the property located at 7820 Coley Davis, Parcel ID# 14100007400 that Metro leases (and subleases) from the State of Tennessee Department of Transportation. The current lease with TDOT expires on December 31, 2037. Metro has a need for a new mobile emissions testing site in the Bellevue area and requests the Park Board's approval of an amendment to the lease with TDOT to allow the site to be utilized for this purpose.
- 11-21-06 Ms. Jenny Hannon, President of Friends of Warner Parks, requests board to accept an in-kind grant not to exceed \$3,998,649 from Friends of Warner Parks to fund the next phase of improvements in the Warner Parks. The list of proposed improvement projects is as follows:
