January 31, 2013

The Metropolitan Nashville-Davidson County Transportation Commission (TLC) met in regular session on this date at the Metropolitan Courthouse. Present were Vice Chair Brian Winfrey, Commissioners Sal Hernandez, Rhonda Marko, Tom Turner, Pat McNally and Curt Wallen (6). Also present were Metro Legal Advisers Theresa Costonis and Rachelle Gallimore-Scruggs along with TLC staff members Lisa Steelman, Debbie Saddler, Walter Lawhorn and Interim Director Billy Fields.

Vice Chair Brian Winfrey called the meeting to order and introduced Pat McNally as the new TLC member then led the Pledge of Allegiance followed by a reading of the Notice of Appeal Statement which outlined the right of appeal for TLC decision.

Commissioner Wallen, with a second from Commissioner Marko, moved to approve the minutes from the previous meeting.

Public Hearing on Certificates of Convenience and Necessity for Taxicabs

At the conclusion of this portion of the meeting, the following individuals spoke including Mike Kaiser, Tegegne Tujo, Sileshi Dejane, DeYuna Bailey, Adugna Denbel, Hassan Jeeaya, Godwin Poima and Mohamed Hassan.

The Chair closed the public hearing to allow the TLC an opportunity to discuss the issues. Interim Director Fields explained that the TLC was not bound by its decision for the August, 2013 meeting to assign 60 new taxicab permits at this meeting. Legal Adviser Theresa Costonis explained that the TLC could rescind and amend its actions to allow for any additional permits.

Following additional discussion on the matter, Commissioner Turner, with a second from Vice Chair Hernandez, moved to rescind the TLC action from the August meeting with provided that 60 taxicab permits would be assigned at the January 2013 and to allocate and assign 110 new permits.

Action: Passed 5-0.

Commissioner Turner, with a second from Vice Chair Hernandez, moved that Green Cab be assigned 35 permits, Kwik Cab be assigned 35, TennCab be assigned 35 and Volunteer Taxi assigned 5.

Action: Failed 2-3-1 with the Chair voting "No" to break the 2-2-1 tie.

Commissioner Wallen, with a second from Commissioner Marko, moved to assign 35 permits to Green Cab, 25 to Kwik Cab, 35 to TennCab and 15 to Volunteer Taxi.

Action: Approved 5-0.

Commissioner Turner moved that a 10 percent bonus of additional taxicab permits to any company that will place handicap accessible vehicles into the fleet. The motion failed with no second.

Interim Director Fields asked for guidance in how soon these new taxicabs should be in service. Commissioner Turner, with a second from Commissioner Wallen, moved that the new taxicabs should be in service within 120 days.

Action: Approved 5-0.

The TLC then took a five minute recess.

Public Hearing on Horse Drawn Carriage Rules

Interim Director Fields explained that TLC Horse-Carriage Rule 5 prohibited solicitation by the carriage companies with the downtown area. He explained that based on advice from Metro Legal, this rule could be considered a violation of the law and asked that the rule be vacated.

The Chair opened the public hearing and Elizabeth Luckey, Sam Roberts and Matthew Clark spoke against vacating the rule.

After some discussion, Vice Chair Hernandez moved, with a second from Commissioner Marko, to vacate the rule.

Taxicabs
