Slow Moving Vehicle Study Presentation

Bob Murphy, KCI Technologies, presented report about slow moving vehicle traffic in the downtown area. After the presentation and some discussion, it was determined that a public hearing will be held at the March, 2018 TLC meeting to consider any changes to the rules or code recommendations for pedal vehicles and low speed vehicles. A public hearing will be held at the April, 2018 meeting to consider any changes to the rules or code recommendations for horse carriages.

Complaint Reviews

Amanji Abdeh appeared regarding his complaint against AB Collier for several violation of the MCL 6.80. Ed Hiland, attorney and Robert Dunn, appeared to represent AB Collier. Mr. Abdeh presented his complaint and AB Collier responded. Inspector Morris and Director Fields were also asked questions. After some discussion, Vice Chair Turner with a second from Commissioner Warren moved to find no violations.

ACTION: Approved 3-0-1

Parking Enforcement, represented by Tim McCready, appeared to answer complaints filed by Garry Baker, Kevin Dabrowski and Rebecca and Eric Warren of violations of the booting services code.

Mr. Baker and Dr. Dabrowski shared their complaints; however, the Warrens were not present. After some discussion and questions, the TLC took the following actions.

Vice Chair Turner with a second from Commissioner Warren moved to find no violations in Mr. Baker's complaint.

Vice Chair Turner with a second from Commissioner Powell moved to find there was a violation in Dr. Dabrowski's complaint with the sign being improperly installed and require a refund.

A complaint filed by Kama Warren-Zuniga was deferred to the March meeting with a motion from Vice Chair Tuner and a second from Commissioners Warren.

Michael Winters, representing Cruzzin', appeared to present his plans for modification of the low speed vehicle operational area. No action was taken.

Director Fields reported that Cotton's/Tow Pro has entered into a purchase agreement with AB Collier. A request for transfer of the emergency wrecker zone will be considered at the March meeting in a public hearing.
