Your appeal must be filed within 60 days of the date of the entry of the Commission's decision. We advise that you seek your own independent legal advice to ensure that your appeal is filed in a timely manner and that all procedural requirements have been met."

Commissioner Woods requested that item f be removed from the consent agenda. The motion was seconded and approved by the Commission. Chip Knauf advised that there is a request to defer action on this item for 1 month. This was approved by Commissioner Woods and seconded by Officer Gilliland.

Councilmember O'Connell mentioned that the agenda for loading zones should be take a more strategic approach or direction.

Motion to approve the consent agenda was approved by Commissioner Woods and seconded by Officer Gilliland. The Consent agenda was approved with no opposition.

### OTHER ITEMS

- Update on COORD Parking Program

Derek Hagerty made the presentation on the COORD Parking Program. He advised the current program end at the end of December. He advised the Nashville Downtown Partnership did a good job of spreading the word. There was a 2-week grace period when the program began. The current program is funded thru a grant program. There are currently 19 fleets signed up for the program and 240 drivers. There is a consideration being given to extend the smart loading zone. There is a potential to include musician loading zone and provide for parking for large conventions. Commissioner Robbins requested information about the zone being utilized for large convention. Derek Hagerty advised currently we do have the ability to cut off zone if they are needed for other uses. Chip Knauf advised they will have updated information based on the Parking Modernization Plan. Dawn Miller with COORD joined by zoom and she advised to expand the program that they would look at a revenue share based on booking. Commissioner Green asked about other cities that have the same program. Ms. Miller advised Aspen, Colorado.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Traffic and Parking Commission of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, Tennessee as follows:

SECTION I: That Chapter 12 of said Metropolitan Code, said Chapter being entitled 'Vehicles and Traffic' is amended as follows:

SECTION II. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution be published in a daily newspaper in Metropolitan Nashville/Davidson County, Tennessee, and that a certified copy be filed with the Chief of Police of the Metropolitan Police Department, and that a certified copy be filed with the Metropolitan clerk, and that said Resolution take effect five (5) days thereafter.
