"Special Called Emergency" Meeting

May 3, 2018 at 9:00 a.m.

The Davidson County Election Commission (DCEC) met on May 3, 2018 at 9:00 a.m. in the Antioch Room at Metro Southeast. Commissioners Jim DeLanis, AJ Starling, Emily Reynolds, Tricia Herzfeld and Jesse Neil were present. DCEC staff members present included: Administrator of Elections (AOE) Jeff Roberts, Joan Nixon, Courtney Mott, Bobby Medley and Kelley Harrison. Also present were Nicki Eke and Lora Fox of the Metropolitan Department of Law.

Commissioner DeLanis convened the meeting.

<u>Unlocking the voting machines pursuant to T.C.A. 2-9-108 through candidate agreement or court order</u>

Lora Fox of Metropolitan Department of Law explained due to Davidson County having to hold a standalone countywide Mayoral election on May 24, 2018, the consent from candidates who appeared on the May 1, 2018 County Primary election must be obtained to unlock the voting machines in preparation of the "Special Election." If consent by all candidates cannot be obtained, a court order must be filed. AOE Roberts has already received consent from several of the candidates from the May 1st Election with the exception of approximately fifteen (15) candidates.

Discussion ensued among the Commission.

Motion stated: Commissioner Herzfeld made a motion to file a court order to open the voting machines if AOE Roberts has not received consent from all of the candidates from the May 1, 2018 ballot by Monday, May 7, 2018.
