Mr. Lynch introduced Dennis Morrow, Recreation Leader from Coleman Regional Center, to the board and informed them that on February 23 Mr. Morrow saved Mrs. Tiffany Sweeny's life. Below are Dennis' lifesaving actions on Saturday February 23rd via Mrs. Sweeny:

I wanted to write to recognize and thank Dennis Morrow for saving my life when I unexpectedly became unconscious while swimming on Saturday February 23. If he had not been paying as close attention I could have most definitely had lasting damage or even drowned. I am so very grateful for his actions and for him attending to me until the paramedics got there. There was also a female (who I believe worked there) who helped with my children but I did not get her name. I would like to get both of their email addresses to thank them personally.

When admitted to the hospital it was discovered I had an arrhythmia which they believed caused the sudden syncope episode. I have been scheduled to have a procedure to correct the issue with my heart, so I can resume my normal activities. It makes you stop and take a look at your life and realize just how quickly and unexpectedly everything can change. I am truly grateful to have the second chance after such a terrifying incident and it is definitely due to the attention and actions of Mr. Morrow.

The board expressed their utmost appreciation to Mr. Morrow.

Therefore, Mr. Lynch has asked Mr. Morrisey, Parks' rep from the Metro Legal Department, to assist in rewriting this ordinance to acknowledge sponsorships and Mr. Morrisey advised Mr. Lynch that the Metro code will have to be changed first.

XIII. REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR

Mr. Lynch reported:

- There is an ordinance before Metro Council that will allow for dog parks to exist which will permit constituents to walk dogs off leash; however this will require Parks Board approval as well as councilmanic approval of district of requested area.
- With the settlement of satellite cities there is a possibility of park land to be developed in Forest Hills from Radnor Lake to Warner Parks.

XIII. REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR (con't.)

Mr. Lynch reported:

- Update regarding a development that is ongoing in the old Hickory (Lakewood) community. About a year or so ago, that community voted to become a part of Metro rather than their own incorporated area. Parks had already accepted some park land and a ballpark; however, it appears there is more to come our way. Presently, the district operates an art center, community center, a girls' softball complex, a small greenway and another park area and in all probability within 60-90 days negotiations will conclude and some-most-or all will be coming our way. The entire operation is funded through water bills in the Old Hickory Utility District. Once the Old Hickory Utility District goes under the Metro Water Services Department I anticipate being notified when the acquisition will come our way and whether something is included in Parks' budget for next year or if funding will continue, but through the Metro Water Services Department. As with any property acquisition it will be brought to the board for acceptance. Please note that Parks will permit the ballfields as we currently do at other park sites. I am meeting next week with the Director of Water Services and the Deputy Mayor regarding this acquisition. There is also a possibility that the art center may go under the Metro Arts Commission, and that the fitness/ community center will be operated by a local 501.C.3 organization.
- Parks budget hearing with Mayor Dean was held on March 28 and it went well. Parks submitted a 2% budget reduction as required of all Metro Departments by Mr. Riebeling, Finance Director. This reduction equated to \$421.900 and in addition Parks submitted request totaling \$2,414,600 for system wide improvements which included 12 maintenance positions and \$90,000 in equipment. Our departmental budget hearing before the Metropolitan Council is scheduled for Wednesday, May 29, 2013 at 5:30 pm in the Council Chambers.
