Mr. Hank Delvin, representing the East Nashville Farmers Market, was present to request permission to utilize green space adjacent to the ballfields in Shelby Park on Wednesday afternoon, 2:00 – 7:00 pm, May 7 – October 29, 2014 to host a farmer's market from the board.

Upon motion of Mr. Fossick, seconded by Ms. Chase, the board approved this request. Mr. Delvin requested an amendment to the hours of the market from 2:00 – 7:00 pm to 3:00 – 6:30 pm and the board approved. Regulations of the market are as follows:

- operate market on Wednesday evenings, 3:00 6:30 pm, May 7 October 29, 2014.
- use vendors only selling goods that are agricultural based products originating in Tennessee or from within a 150 mile radius of Nashville; thereby, eliminating the sale of jewelry, arts and crafts.
- observe the parking regulations which will be established before your market opens.
- be responsible for liability insurance, comply with use agreement and provide for the general safety of event.
- No one, including vendors, may park or drive under the drip line of trees in Shelby Park.
- No signage, crates, or debris should be leaning or stacked against trees.

East Nashville Farmers Market will be assessed a weekday use fee of \$60.00 per day, per week. (\$60.00/week x 26 weeks = \$1,560 for the 2014 season) As per Board Policy a financial statement be made available to us within 30 days following the final market of the season.
