XIV. REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR

Mr. Lynch announced to the board the passing of Dr. George Reichardt, who chaired the Parks Board from 1963-1993.

Mr. Lynch informed the board of a community meeting held on Tuesday, March 25 at West Park Community Center regarding a potential partnership with Metro Water Services Department relating to West Park. Metro Water Services is looking for land to purchase to locate a "rain" tank on. In West Park at the end of a service road there is an existing tank; instead of Water Services purchasing new property they have proposed to allocate approximately 2 million dollars of improvements to West Park in exchange for use of the tank and service road. They have proposed a ¹/₂ mile walking trail, playground, relocation of ballfields and connect England, West and Richland Parks by trail. If proposal of partnership comes to fruition, it will be brought to the board for approval.

The 2014-15 budget hearing with Mayor Dean was held Monday, March 31 at 12:30 pm and Metro Parks presented budget with a 3% cut as required by the Finance Department. During the hearing potential additions to Parks were discussed and well received by Mayor Dean and the Finance Department.

XV. ANNOUNCEMENTS/REQUESTS FOR FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS

Mr. Fossick stated the he attended the budget hearing before Mayor Dean and that budget was well presented. He encouraged board members to talk with councilmembers regarding Parks' requests and asked that all board members try to attend Parks' budget hearing before Metro Council.

Because Tuesday, May 6 is Election Day in Nashville; Mr. Fossick made motion to move the May board meeting to Tuesday, May 13; Mr. Ponder seconded, and the board agreed to amend the date of the May meeting.

Also, a suggestion of hosting the May meeting at Shelby Bottoms Nature Center was considered.

Mr. Anderson asked if a follow-up email on dog signage in Councilmember Westerholm's district had been directed.

Mr. Anderson acknowledged Ms. Sally Davis, Assistant Director of Parks, for help in team building exercises and transporting children from Napier, Easley and Kirkpatrick centers to receive 50 bicycles. He extended "GREAT JOB" to her.

Ms. Juliana Ospina-Cano read her resignation letter to the board and reported that she has accepted a job in Washington, DC. The board wished her the very best and thanked her for serving on the board. Ms. Ospina-Cano stated that her official letter of resignation should be received by Metro Parks in the upcoming week.

XV. ANNOUNCEMENTS/REQUESTS FOR FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS

Mr. Anderson requested that a unified policy with regard to cell towers be added to the agenda for the yet to be determined meeting of the policy committee of the Parks Board.

With there being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
