# BOARD APPROVES ACQUISITION OF A 3.77 ACRE TRACT LOCATED AT 402 HATHAWAY COURT FOR ESTABLISHEMENT OF WEST MEADE WATERFALL PARK

Correspondence submitted by staff requesting board to approve acquisition of a 3.77 acre tract located at 402 Hathaway Court for establishment of West Meade Waterfall Park was presented to the board.

With recommendation from the board's acquisition committee, upon motion of Mr. Fossick, and seconded by Ms. Garcia, the Board accepted this acquisition. Acquisition of this 3.77 acre tract located at 402 Hathaway Court, map 129-05-5, from the Tennessee Parks & Greenways Foundation for establishment of West Meade Waterfall Park using \$50,000 in existing funds. The purchase will be at half its acquisition cost and more than half below its appraised value. The Tennessee Parks and Greenways Foundation purchased the property for \$100,000, and the property appraised for \$210,000 in October 2012. Conservation of the property is consistent with the Open Space Plan which recommends preservation of lands in the arc of remaining green space in the southwest quadrant of Davidson County including the West Meade forests and hilltops. Metro Park's participation in the project will provide public access to the property for creation of a mini park.

# BOARD APPROVES STAFF REQUEST TO SURPLUS .18 ACRE IN OLD HICKORY

Approval to surplus .18 acre on University Avenue in Old Hickory (.09 acre on parcel 06308003100 and .09 acre on parcel 06308003200) was submitted by staff to the board for consideration.

Upon motion of Mr. Fossick, seconded by Dr. Brannon, the Board approved the surplus of .18 acre on University Avenue in Old Hickory (.09 acre on parcel 06308003100 and .09 acre on parcel 06308003200). This property was originally acquired by Metro as back tax property in 1978 and 1973 respectively, and recently Parks became aware that the properties are classified as belonging to Parks. Property has not been maintained by Parks and is not well situated for recreational use as a pocket park as the majority of the property is located behind homes in this neighborhood.
