BOARD GRANTS PERMISSION TO THE BOYS AND GIRLS CLUB OF MIDDLE TENNESSEE TO ENTER INTO A PERMIT FOR FACILITY USE FOR A PERIOD OF ONE YEAR FOR USE OF WEST PARK COMMUNITY CENTER

Upon motion of Mr. Fossick, seconded by Mr. Sueing, the Board granted approval to the Boys and Girls Club of Middle Tennessee to enter a permit with Metro Parks for use of West Park Community Center to provide youth academic enrichment programming after school and during summer break.

The Boys and Girls Club will supply the necessary resources, such as personnel and educational materials, to operate youth development and academic enrichment after school and summer programs at West Park Community Center. The Boys and Girls Club will also provide at least \$1,000,000 commercial general liability insurance, \$1,000,000 automobile liability insurance, and \$1,000,000 sexual molestation and abuse coverage with Metro Parks named as an additional insured with regard to the referenced insurance policies.

During the initial year of this permit, Metro Parks agrees to bear 100% of the costs for utilities, water, and building maintenance associated with the center. Each year thereafter that this permit is renewed, Metro Parks' responsibility for the costs of utilities, water, and building maintenance will be reduced by 25% per year. At the start of year five (5) of the permit, if the permit is renewed, all utilities, water and building maintenance associated with the center will become the responsibility of the Boys and Girls Club. Metro Parks will be responsible for the upkeep of the exterior grounds and athletic fields.

BOARD APPROVES ACQUISITION OF APPROXIMATELY 23.61 ACRES FOR ESTABLISHMENT OF A WALK TO PARK FROM FAITH UNITED BAPTISH CHURCH

Per recommendation of the Acquisition Committee, and upon motion of Mr. Sueing, seconded by Ms. Garcia, the board approved acquisition of 23.61 acres located at 0 Buena Vista Pike, map 059-00-0, parcel 060.01, 23.09 acres, and 3963 Crouch Drive, map 059-06-0, parcel 053.00, .52 acres from Faith United Baptist Church.

The property will serve a highly populated adjacent neighborhood for a future walk-to park suitable for a playground, multi-purpose play field and walking trail. The property is located in the floodplain of Ewing Creek, a community plan greenway corridor, and features creek frontage, an open field and wooded areas. Faith United Baptist Church is offering the property for \$55,000, which the Metro Assessor's Office has assessed for \$93,000. There are two access points to the adjoining neighborhood. Existing 2015 capital funds will used.

BOARD APPROVES ACQUISITION AND DONATION OF APPROXIMATELY 568 ACRES ON LITTLE MARROWBONE ROAD FOR EXPANSION OF BEAMAN PARK

Per recommendation of the Acquisition Committee, and upon motion of Mr. Sueing, seconded by Dr. Brannon, the board approved acquisition of 568 acres (map and parcels 45-6, 46-1, and 45.5) on Little Marrowbone Road for expansion of Beaman Park.

BOARD APPROVES ACQUISITION AND DONATION OF APPROXIMATELY 568 ACRES ON LITTLE MARROWBONE ROAD FOR EXPANSION OF BEAMAN PARK

The Gilbert property available for \$1,000 per acre is two-thirds its appraised value, for a total of \$568,000. This will increase the size of Beaman Park from 1,656.16 to 2,224 acres. The acquisition will protect view sheds of Beaman Park, increase access with road frontage on Little Marrowbone Road, be suitable for extensive hiking and for uses such as mountain biking prohibited in original area of Beaman Park designated as a State Natural Area. It contains older growth trees and scenic vistas. A third interest in the property is being donated by Harris Gilbert. The bargain sale was negotiated by the Land Trust for Tennessee toward implementation of the Open Space Plan.

XII. CAPITAL PROJECTS UPDATE

Tim Netsch reported:

- Phase one of the Centennial Park Master Plan is scheduled for completion before September 1, 2015.
- Ribbon Cutting at Cockrill Spring (front lawn of Centennial Park) scheduled for Thursday, August 27th at 10:30 am.
- The East lawn/landing of Cumberland Park should be completed within 4-5 weeks with a tentative opening scheduled for September 12th at 8:00 am.
- Nashville Parks Plan Guiding document for department is out to bid, with bids due August 27. (Jenn Garcia is on the consulting team). This is a 10 year plan and will return to the board for approval.
- Shelby Naval Building Rehab/Lease 2.4 million rehab offering profit/non-profit office space, special event space, café, and retail area for bike and water activity with request for exchange for parking improvements/landscaping. Term at point of negotiation of lease should comply with park policies with regard to events. Ms. Smith asked that language be included to support the Nashville Parks Foundation financially. Proposal is consistent with the 2009 Shelby Park Master Plan and Mr. Anderson recommended that proposal come before the board so they could familiarize themselves with project.
- Edwin Warner Burch Reserve Connector Phase 1 funded with TDOT grant and should be completed by the end of August 2015. Phase 2 is under construction. (Design complete Metro and CS/Sprint ongoing negotiations)
- Percy Warner Park Parking improvements completed at Deep Well, Gaucho Road and Chickering Road; other locations complete winter 2015-16.

XIV. REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR

Mr. Lynch reported:

- At each board member's place there is a copy of a letter from Sarah Martin, "Sarah for Metro Council" with regard to an event, District 5 Block Party, held on Saturday, July 18 and hosted by Ms. Martin in Cleveland Park. A phone call was received on day of said event stating there was a political event occurring in Cleveland Park in which board approval was not secured. A request was made to have park police come and shut down the event; however, because of the large number in attendance, the event was not suspended.
- Immediately following the September Board meeting a public recognition of the naming of the Metro Parks Administrative Complex in honor of James H. Fyke will be held.
- Ascend Amphitheatre opened on Thursday, July 30th before a sold out crowd. A meeting was held today (August 4) regarding 12,000 punch list items of the newly opened park. The major issue being very dry foliage and that issue is being addressed. Live Nation appears to be a great partner with the park clean and ready for the next event.
- Fort Negley. Met with Mayor Dean, Deputy Mayor Hinote and members of the Homeless Commission and will provide an aerial map to the Homeless Commission to assist in relocating those who can be relocated. After relocation, camp will be cleared beginning September 1st. Hopefully, trails will be constructed from Fort Negley to the Adventure Science Center to be utilized as a learning tool for youth.
- Met with Sally Davis, Assistant Director of Parks/Community Recreation, regarding replacement of the tennis bubble in Hadley Park and we are currently reaching out to Tennessee State University in hopes of establishing a partnership with them similar to Belmont and E. S. Rose Park.
- Women's Suffrage Monument media was erroneous in report of selected site location of monument on the grounds of the Tennessee State Capital and may come to board for site approval in Centennial Park at a later date.

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XV. ANNOUNCEMENTS/REQUESTS FOR FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS

Mr. Anderson requested that a parking policy be established for all parks in Nashville, under the jurisdiction of Metro Parks, so that they do not remain or become a parking area for those not using parks.
