VIII. METRO COUNCIL REFERRALS

Councilmember Colby Sledge reported to the board that 130 individuals attended the community meeting regarding the Greer Stadium site on Wednesday, September 21 and approximately 70 were in attendance on Saturday, September 24 with both meetings being held at the Adventure Science Center.

Councilmember Sledge stated that there is an online survey available on the Metro Planning Commission's website until Friday, October 7. Survey participants may select their choice of use for this open space and as of October 4th there are 75 responses.

Once final results are tallied from the meetings and online surveys, a meeting will be scheduled with the Mayor's Office and then a recommendation will be brought back before the Metro Parks Board.

UPDATE ON RESERVOIR PARK AS PER REQUEST OF COUNCILMEMBER SLEDGE

Councilmember Colby Sledge, representing District 17, was present regarding an update on the security issues surrounding Reservoir Park.

- Captain Chris Taylor stated that there have been no reported incidents and if there is an issue regarding the homeless in the Park Social Services has been immediately contacted.
- Mr. Lynch reported stated that he has empathy toward the new residents as the physical layout of the park, 8th Avenue bordering one side and the Reservoir boarding the other, is difficult to navigate. However, soon the park will double in size when Metro Water Services completes work regarding the Reservoir tank lending to better serving the immediate community.
- Mr. Taylor, Assistant Director/Maintenance, stated that the lights have been removed from the court behind the homes of the concerned homeowners. The lights on the court on the 8th Avenue side are now operating and soon will be operating with a new timing system with a battery backup.
- Councilmember Sledge reported that there is still activity in the parking lot and requested increased police presence. He also reported that a basketball rim needs to be replaced. He then asked when the park signage will go up and Mr. Taylor stated that signage has been ordered and once received signage will be installed.

- Construction on the Stones River Dog Park should be completed by the end of October with the opening event scheduled in November.
- Shelby Stream Mitigation is in design phase.
- Construction delayed by conflict with CSX and negotiations underway at the Burch Reserve Connector in Edwin Warner Park.
