Ms. Angela Goodard, representing Friends of Kimbro Station was present to request consideration of the board to establish Friends of Kimbro Station as an official volunteer support group to Metro Parks.

Ms. Goddard provided background information of this request to the board:

- July 2013 –Joe C. Davis Foundation began researching a new investment priority focusing on health, wellness and livability.
- September 2013 –Joe C. Davis Foundation narrowed search to health and wellness opportunities through outdoor recreation and parks.
- October 2014 –July 2015: Over 581 acres of land identified in southeast quadrant of the City (last quadrant in need of a large, regional anchor park Open Space Plan).

- Private/public partnership with Shain Dennison (Metro Parks), Ralph Knoll (The Conservation Fund), and the Joe C. Davis Foundation.
- Metro Board of Parks and Recreation approved acquisition of land –July 7, 2015; 581 acres valued at \$15,369,111.
- September 2015 –land acquired with Metro Council's approved funding of ~\$11.2 million; Joe C. Davis Foundation contribution of \$4.1 million for acquisition and \$150,000 in ancillary expenses; and ~\$1,150,000 in charitable contributions –short sale -from landowners.
- June 2016 -Metro Council and Mayor Barry approved \$250,000 for site-specific master plan.
- March 2017 –under the leadership of Tim Netsch and Rebecca Ratz, a sitespecific master planning team assembled: Collier Engineering, Nelson Byrd Woltz, Tara Armistead and Hodgson Douglas.
- March -December 2017 -master planning process.

Strategic Goals for Parks at Kimbro Station (PAKS)

- Joe C. Davis Foundation has secured the services of organizational development consultant, Michelle Doane.
- Purpose: PAKS strives to become an effective support organization for Metro Parks Dept. for the future development, enhancements and programs for the new parks in Southeast Nashville.

Short-term goals:

- Infrastructure and organization structure for PAKS (membership levels, corporate levels).
- Create master database of all stakeholders and engagement strategies.
- Attend community engagement meetings to raise awareness of PAKS.
- Assist Ben Freeland and other directors in identifying corporate philanthropic partners for phase I private/public park development campaign.

John Holmes – Presented a video from the National BMX event held on Memorial Day Weekend in Hamilton Creek Park. John thanked the employees of the maintenance division for their work in preparing the track and facility for this event.

XIII. CAPITAL PROJECTS UPDATE

Tim Netsch reported the following updates:

- **Brake Park** Hazmat remediation/demolition has begun and should be complete summer 2017.
- **Centennial Park Master Plan** Have construction documents for the great lawn. Schematic design underway for the Children's Memorial and Playground and should be complete summer 2017.
- **Madison Recreation Center** Floors have been poured and the walls are up, estimated completion date spring 2018.
- Ravenwood/Lytle Bend Master Plan Hayrides and Hikes was successful in introducing the area to park patrons. A community planning meeting will be scheduled end of summer.
- **Southeast/Antioch Master Plan** Hayrides and Hikes was successful in introducing the area to park patrons. A community planning meeting will be scheduled end of summer.
- **Edwin Warner Burch Reserve Connector** Tunneling will begin by June 12 with crews working 24/7 until completion as per CSX requirements.

XIV. REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR

Ms. Odom announced:

 Metro Parks' budget hearing before the Metro Council on May 23 went well and Metro Parks should receive appropriation in the amount of one million dollars in improvements over our recommended operating budget. The improvements include funding for 2 additional police officers, disabilities program, Celebrate Nashville Festival, maintenance requests and partial funding or Madison and Smith Springs Community Centers.
