Clark netting 45.08 new park acres with Ms. Odom granting ultimate approval to the location of an access road to the Southeast Regional Park.

## BOARD APPROVES ACQUISITION AND DISPOSITION OF PARK LAND AT SOUTHEAST DAVIDSON REGIONAL PARK AS PRESENTED BY PARKS STAFF

An easement will be conveyed by Wirtgen America Inc. across the Wirtgen property located at 6030 Dana Way, Metro Parcel ID NO. 17400003000, for right of way purposes to provide access to the Southeast Regional Park from Crossings Boulevard, which is currently inaccessible from Crossings, a major street and future entrance to the park. Metro proposes to sell to Wirtgen approximately 19 acres of property for the price of \$1,064,000.00. (This amounts to \$56,000 an acre. A recent appraisal of Metro's tract was \$40,000 an acre.) The 19 acres is located in an unused corner of the park as identified in the Southeast Regional Park Master Plan. The disposition was anticipated and the 19-acre location therefore was vetted in the master planning analysis by Metro Parks' consultants and staff.

Proceeds of this sale will come to Metro Parks and be used towards the purchase of the Sue B. Clark 64.08-acre Parcel ID NO 17500002400, located at 12900 Old Hickory Blvd. Metro's purchase of this property, as stated, will allow Metro Parks a 45.08 acre net gain of park land. It will close a significant and key gap in Southeast Regional Park assemblage. The Park Board has previously approved this 64.08 acre purchase, but full funding has not been in place and until recently the owner was not willing to sell. The acquisition price is \$2,877,000, supported by a recent appraisal, to be funded through proceeds of the Wirtgen sale and \$1,813,000 in existing Metro parks land acquisition funds. Metro has a 120-day option on the Clark tract, which will expire mid-June.

It is anticipated in Metro transportation plans that Crossings Boulevard eventually may be extended across Southeast Regional Park to connect to Old Hickory Boulevard. In order to provide access to the 19 acres becoming part of Wirtgen property in the event Crossings Boulevard is extended, or a new park entrance roadway is built in lieu of an extension from the current terminus of Crossings Boulevard, Metro agrees to provide to Wirtgen, at no cost, a right of way easement 30 feet wide, beginning at the southeastern most corner of the Wirtgen Tract and connecting to the Crossings Boulevard extension at a point within 200 feet of originating corner.

Mr. Dwight Hall presented the following facts:

- This year is the 77<sup>th</sup> year of the Iroquois Steeplechase being held in the same location and was built by the WPA.
- This event generally attracts 25,000+ attendees with 56% being between the ages of 35-54 and 41% are CEO's/ Presidents.
- Ten million dollars+ have been donated to the Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital at Vanderbilt.
- Individual tickets in the infield are now available.
- Fox Den a new tented venue located in the infield which includes music and food.
- Children under 12 are admitted at no cost.
- All inclusive tailgating available which includes tent rental and food.
- Skybox luxury suites
- Enhanced social media
- Return \$20,000 annually to the Friends of Warner Parks
- Painted, repaired box areas this year at a cost of \$49,000
- Maintaining the barn major termite damage, painted the barn and office at a cost of \$46,000
- Repaired and painted perimeter board fencing at a cost of (\$20,000)
- Currently working on expansion of the box seat area.

The board thanked Mr. Hall and his associates for all of the hard work they put into this event yearly and for all of the assistance/contributions provided to Metro Parks.

Ms. Lindsey Moffatt, representing Friends of Sevier Parks, was in attendance to update the board on the accomplishments of this organization.

- Establishment of the friends group in 2013
- First concert was held in 2014; this year's concert is scheduled for Friday, May 4<sup>th</sup> with J. Roddy Walston and the Business with SUSTO and Amanda Shires performing.
- Festival is set for Saturday, May 5<sup>th</sup> and free to the public; food trucks, vendors, games/activities for children, etc. (Glidden Paint is the sponsor)
- A perimeter walk around the park has been completed.
- A water fountain has been added.
- Held a cleanup of Brown's Creek tributary
- Providing a pop-up water park in July or August
