Mr. Tom Cross, representing the Metro Legal Department was also present.

Dr. Michelle Steele, chair, called the meeting to order and stated that the first order of business will be a motion to determine under the Governor's Executive Order #16 that the meeting agenda constitutes essential business of this board and meeting electronically is necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of Tennesseans in light of the COVID-19 outbreak. Ms. Tari Hughes moved for approval, Ms. Scott-Barnes seconded, and the board approved without objection.

# BOARD APPROVES PARKING AGREEMENT BETWEEN METRO PARKS AND CHEEKWOOD BOTANICAL GARDENS AND MUSEUM OF ART

As per recommendation of the Acquisition Committee, upon motion of Ms. Hughes, seconded by Ms. Scott-Barnes, the board granted approval to a parking agreement between Metro Parks and Cheekwood Botanical Gardens and Museum of Art as follows:

• Cheekwood's monthly parking fee will remain frozen at \$4000 per month.

# BOARD APPROVES PARKING AGREEMENT BETWEEN METRO PARKS AND CHEEKWOOD BOTANICAL GARDENS AND MUSEUM OF ART

- As per the parking agreement Cheekwood will now submit 75% of their monthly payment to Friends of Warner Parks and 25% to Metro Parks.
- Because of the COVID-19 pandemic Cheekwood has experienced lost revenue and the impact will continue with modified operations during the reopening phase; therefore, Cheekwood will not be charging for parking.
- The parking agreement will be extended 4 years and will expire December 2024. Utilization of the areas to the southwest of the entrance into Cheekwood for overflow parking on a regular basis will continue and will include the gated area known as the slash dump. Parks will continue to utilize this as an active storage area for natural vegetation and tree limbs, etc. simply focusing on the edges of the dump site. Additionally, after dusk, the parking area next to our golf course clubhouse may be used for valet parking during special events.
- Cheekwood will present a biannual report to Metro Parks with regard to development of on-site parking.
- No permanent parking improvements are permitted. Minor maintenance in overflow parking areas are permitted with Metro Parks approval. Cheekwood is responsible for all damage and other impacts of use.
- Cheekwood has agreed to begin development of plans to create a solution to their parking needs on Cheekwood's property.

Parks and Cheekwood will agree to communicate on a regular basis pertaining to events on both sites which may impact the other entity.

# BOARD APPROVES STAFF REQUEST TO ENTER INTO A LICENSE AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE OF TENNESSEE TO INSTALL, MAINTAIN AND OPERATE A PEDESTRIAN WALKING TRAIL ON AN EXISTING SECTION OF THE STONES RIVER GREENWAY

As per recommendation of the Acquisition Committee, upon motion of Mr. Anderson, seconded by Ms. Scott-Barnes, the board approved staff request to enter into a License Agreement (Project No. 19041-3269-94 BR-STP-24(20) with the State of Tennessee to install, maintain and operate a pedestrian walking trail on an existing section of the Stones River Greenway in ROW at Lebanon Road that provides connectivity to the Kohl's trailhead to the south and Ravenwood Park to the north. This is an existing 10-year renewable license set to begin in 2020 and will expire in 2030. Please note that this license is provided at no cost to Metro Parks and/or the Metropolitan Government, with the exception of routine maintenance.

# BOARD ACCEPTS GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$150,000 FROM THE FRIENDS OF WARNER PARKS FOR REPAIRS TO THE WARNER PARKS NATURE CENTER

## X. REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR

- In reference to email sent the board regarding the hiring freeze, operational savings and capital spending suspension, Ms. Odom reiterated the implications of such a reduction related to the referendum as this is very serious for the Parks Department both from operations and a capital perspective. Metro Parks operations will be cut 35% and will result in layoffs and closures. Senior Staff have been made aware of the possibilities and we will move as the budget dictates. Ms. Odom will keep the board apprised. Even before the pending referendum a hiring freeze and a request for reduced spending has been implemented throughout Metro. Our department is currently understaffed and underfunded so streamlining spending will manifest on shortfalls of the department. However, in spite of impending reductions, our staff is working diligently.
- As you know this fiscal year Metro Parks received \$450,000 to open neighborhood centers on Saturday for half days and we are happy to report that 7 centers opened this past Saturday. Metro Park is grateful for these hours and look forward to expanding to all centers.
- Programming has shifted due to Covid-19 Hadley Park Line Dancers and Centennial Performing Arts Dance Classes are utilizing the Centennial Park Event Shelter for their activities.
- Due to moving into Phase 3 of the reopening of Nashville, the Sportsplex is beginning to offer classes once again.
- Metro Parks disABILITIES group is hosting a bocce ball event with social distancing. This program is one of our most requested and currently has a waiting list.

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# X. REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR (con't.)

• Metro Parks has received a proposal from the Historic Capitol Corridor Foundation to delay improvements to Church Street Park until Spring. The park is currently fenced because of improvements; however, it denies accessibility to public land. This group will be asked to attend the November Parks Board meeting to discuss proposal to delay improvements. (Mr. Anderson asked Ms. Odom if the group was granted permission to extend their agreement regarding Church Street Park and if the article which appeared in the *Tennessean* came from Metro Parks? Ms. Odom answered no to both questions.)
