# BOARD APPROVES EXTENSION OF A LICENSE AGREEMENT BETWEEN METRO PARKS AND THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY FOR LIMITED TRAINING PURPOSES

Upon motion Ms. Hughes, seconded by Ms. Scott-Barnes, the board granted approval to an extension of a current license agreement between The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, acting by and through the Board of Parks and Recreation, and the United States of America, acting by and through the Department of the Army, to enter certain parks, operated and maintained by the Department of Parks and recreation, for limited training purposes. The agreement places any liability and damages caused by the training on the Department of the Army (US Government). Once approved by the Parks Board, this agreement will go to the Metro Council for further approval.

This is the renewal of a license to allow the Department of the Army (160 Special Operations Aviation Regiment/Fort Campbell) to enter Shelby Park at Cornelia Fort Airpark for limited rotary wing military training purposes (helicopters). This training has been conducted at Cornelia Fort Airpark for several years with official approval from the Parks Board and the Metro Council in 2017. The training occurs four or five times a year, after dark, and has caused no issues or problems. The 160 Special Operations Aviation Regiment always gives advance notice to Parks Department staff, Parks Police and area Metro Council Representatives.

### X. REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR

Ms. Odom introduced and welcomed Mary Peoples to the Metro Parks staff. Mary will replace Janet Frazier upon her upcoming retirement from Metro Parks. Ms. Odom thanked Janet for her service and urged board members to stop by the office if they have an opportunity or call to welcome Mary.

## Ms. Odom reported:

- The proposed referendum for appealing the property tax will not move forward. Parks budget currently remains as passed on July 1, 2020. A mid-year budget meeting with the Finance Department will be scheduled later this month to evaluate status of the budget and discuss the next steps in moving forward.
- Chinita White, Finance and Administration Assistant Director, is currently coordinating a finance sub-committee with board member Hughes. Please remember that all board members are members of the finance committee.

# X. REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR (con't.)

- Janet Frazier is scheduling a meeting of the Policy Committee Working Group. This group is composed of Dr. Gentry, Jeff Haynes, Macy Amos and Monique Odom. This group is tasked with making proposed revisions to the naming policy to be submitted to the policy committee so that we can move forward with any requests before the board.
- Metro Nashville Public Schools have moved back to remote learning therefore Metro Parks will administer the MNPS Essential Workers Support Program to accommodate any students when out of school. Neighborhood center operating hours will be 10 am-6:30 pm. Regional Centers will operate from 6 am-7 pm. These hours will stay in place until MNPS confirms the learning format. December 17<sup>th</sup> is the beginning of winter break for Metro students and modified programming will be offered at the centers.
- Youth basketball is currently on hold due to safety precautions. Metro Parks
  will look to the Metro Health Department for guidance on reinstating basketball
  leagues.
- Thank you to Greenways for Nashville for posting additional COVID signage with updated graphics at the greenway trailheads.
- Thank you to the Nashville Parks Foundation for once again sponsoring Parks' annual holiday lunch. Although this year's event will be modified, employees are still collecting toys and non-perishable food items for distribution to the appropriate local charities.
- We should move forward in honoring Mr. Stan Fossick for his 30 years of service to the Parks Board at the January or February 2021 meeting. Janet Frazier will coordinate with him in regard to his availability.
