# CALL TO ORDER

Chairman John Green mentioned ordinance No. BL2006-1050 regarding the appeals process of the Traffic and Parking Commission.

"If you are not satisfied with a decision made by the Traffic & Parking Commission, you may appeal the decision by filing for a writ of certiorari with the Davidson County Chancery or Circuit Court. Your appeal must be filed within 60 days of the date of the entry of the Commission's decision. We advise that you seek your own independent legal advice to ensure that your appeal is filed in a timely manner and that all procedural requirements have been met."

- **b) CD19:** Authorize removal of the Mega Bus loading zone on the west side of 5<sup>th</sup> Ave. N. and Gay St.; requested by Metro Public Works
- c) CD11: Authorize 24-hour valet zone to cover 2 spaces on the west side of Neill Ave.; requested by Parking Management Company

Motion was made by Commissioner Williams and seconded by Commissioner Woods to indefinitely defer this item until the requested study is completed.

- d) CD05: Authorize conversion of 2-way stop to all-way stop at intersection of Mansfield St. and Myrtle St.; requested by CM Parker
- e) CD10: Authorize all-way stop at the intersection of Paula Dr. and Twin Hills Dr.; requested by CM Young
- f) CD10: Authorize 3-way stop at the intersection of Paula Dr. and Shepherd Hills Dr.; requested by CM Young
- g) CD13: Authorize traffic signal at the intersection of Bell Road and Heron Pointe Dr.; requested by RG Phillips Consulting
- h) CD19: Authorize all-way stop at the intersection of 3<sup>rd</sup> Ave. S. and Elm St.; requested by resident

## **APPEALS**

1. Request for all way stop at 7th Ave. N. and Monroe St.; requested by resident

After hearing from the residents in the area, a motion was made by CM O'Connell and seconded by Commissioner Woods to approve this item. All in favor, no opposition.

2. Request for all way stop at Vaulx Ln. and Inverness Ave.; requested by CM Sledge

There were several residents present to speak in favor of this item. Motion was made by Commissioner Woods and seconded by Commissioner Williams to approve this item. All in favor no opposition.

## **OTHER ITEMS**

1. Parking Meter overview, Diane Marshall, Metro Public Works

Diane Marshall, Metro Public Works, presented information via PowerPoint regarding Metro Nashville's parking meters. The commissioners had a question and answer session regarding the guidelines and fees documented within the charter as well as the administration process.

Theresa Costonis, Metro Legal, gave a presentation to inform the commissioners of the function and responsibilities of the commission according to Metropolitan charter and code. There was a question and answer session amongst the commissioners regarding the information given in this presentation. The commissioners agreed that this was very informative and would be helpful going forward. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution be published in a daily newspaper in Metropolitan Nashville/Davidson County, Tennessee, and that a certified copy be filed with the Chief of Police of the Metropolitan Police Department, and that a certified copy be filed with the Metropolitan clerk, and that said Resolution take effect five (5) days thereafter.
