CALL TO ORDER

Chairman John Green mentioned ordinance No. BL2006-1050 regarding the appeals process of the Traffic and Parking Commission.

"If you are not satisfied with a decision made by the Traffic & Parking Commission, you may appeal the decision by filing for a writ of certiorari with the Davidson County Chancery or Circuit Court. Your appeal must be filed within 60 days of the date of the entry of the Commission's decision. We advise that you seek your own independent legal advice to ensure that your appeal is filed in a timely manner and that all procedural requirements have been met."

Motion to comply with the Governors Executive Order 16 regarding electronic meetings:

"The items on the meeting agenda constitute essential business of this body and meeting electronically is necessary to protect the health, safety, and welfare of Tennesseans in light of the COVID-19 outbreak" **John Green** motioned for approval of the Motion to comply with the Governors Executive Order 16 regarding electronic meetings. **Sara Lee Woods seconded. All in favor, no opposition.**

- h) CD 32: Authorize no trucks over 8 tons on Asheford Trace from Mt View Road to Summercrest Bvd; requested by resident
- i) CD 32: Authorize no trucks over 8 tons on Summercrest Drive from Asheford Trace to Murfreesboro Pike; requested by resident

CM Freddie O'Connell pointed out that item (a) is in Council District 17 and not Council District 19 as shown on the agenda. Chip Knauf noted that he has talked with CM Sledge who is in favor of approval. The revised consent agenda **20-11** was presented and a motion was made by **Nora Kern** and seconded by **Sara Lee Woods** to approve the consent agenda. **All in favor, no opposition.**

OTHER ITEMS

- a) Update on valet management and operations; Jeff Hammond, Metro Public Works presented an update on the valet. He stated that the focus group is working together and we expect to present the proposed policy at the December Traffic Commission meeting. Chairman Green asked that the Commissioners have any materials to be reviewed in advance of the upcoming meeting.
- b) Briefing on Coord curbside parking project; Derek Hagerty, Metro Public Works

NEW BUSINESS

- a) CD 19: Request for a valet zone at 310 Gay Street; requested by Premier Parking Council Member Freddie O'Connell motioned to defer until December. Sara Lee Woods seconded. All in favor, no opposition.
- b) CD 33: Appeal staff denial for no parking on east end of Country Way Road; Motion to deny by **Nora Kern**. Seconded by **Karen Robbins. All in favor, no opposition.**
 - **Mr. Thomas,** resident of Country Way Road, spoke in favor of the no parking on east end of Country Way Road. The commission recommended speaking to his council member for his district and speaking to the neighbors to form a petition.
- c) D 20: Appeal staff decision to deny the removal of the all way stop at Annex Av and Robertson Av. Disapproval was motioned by **Nora Kern** and seconded by **Sara Lee Woods. All in favor, no opposition.**

Chip Knauf presented the staff recommendation of leaving the traffic control in place.

Elaine Corn, resident of Annex Ave, spoke in favor of the appeal citing truck noise complaints and a lack of pedestrian activity.

Councilmember Roberts spoke in opposition to the appeal.

d) CD 29: Appeal staff decision for installation of an all way stop at Nashboro Blvd and Flintlock Court and authorize reduction in speed limit on Nashboro Blvd, from Murfreesboro Pike to Bell Road, from 35 m.p.h to 30 m.p.h.; requested by CM Porterfield and Vivian Wilhoite, President of HOA. Sara Lee Woods motioned to approve the all ways stop and speed limit reduction, Council Member Freddie O'Connell seconded. All in favor, no opposition.

Vivian Wilhoite, President of HOA spoke in favor of the installation of an all way stop at Nashboro Blvd and Flintlock Court and reduction in speed limit on Nashboro Blvd, from Murfreesboro Pike to Bell Road, from 35 m.p.h. to 30 m.p.h.

CD 19: Authorize 24/7 passenger loading zone at 1212 9th Av N; requested by Thomas and Hutton Engineering

Council Member Freddie O'Connell made a motion for Item to be deferred until the December 2020 meeting. **Sara Lee Woods** seconded. **All in favor, no opposition**. It was discussed that valet operations could continue under a temporary permit until January.
