A. Call to Order

C. Operations

40th Anniversary

Executive Director Jen Cole reported that The Mayor has agreed to do a press announcement of Metro Arts 40th year anniversary on January 18 in the Mayor's media room at 12. During this, the new brand will be presented as well.

Budget

Cole reported the preparation of a flat budget would begin in January, with that a Community Engagement staff person will be requested.

D. Grants

FY19 Grants Guidelines – ACTION

Grants Manager Laurel Fisher explained that the changes presented in the FY19 guidelines will further support the long-term health of arts-focused organizations. The changes are:

Basic Operating Support

- Explanation of 3-year adjudication cycle, with reverification process for Basic Operating applicants who were adjudicated in FY18
- Eligible applicants must be independently operated nonprofits

Core Operating Support

- New Basic Operating Support applicants may apply in this category for requests up to \$20,000 until the next adjudication year
- Eligible applicants must be independently operated nonprofits

Arts Access & Youth Arts Project Support Grants

- Operating Support applicants may apply in this category if the project is different from regular programming and has no overlapping funding sources or elements.
- These grants can be used for project expenses that take place between July 1, 2018 and June 15, 2019 in order
 to allow some summer programming to take place as part of this funding program until a more long-term
 solution is identified.

A motion to accept and approve the FY19 Grant Guidelines was offered by Commissioner Alvis, seconded by Commissioner Haynes, and the motion passed.

Budget: \$4,000 for dance workshops and culminating event *contingent upon revised budget

Budget: \$3,000 for performances
