MCC DBE Contract Compliance Plan

Contract Compliance involves the review and enforcement of specified Diversity Business Enterprise (DBE) utilization plan of the terms and conditions associated with Music City Center related contracts.

The process involves, but not limited to, the collection and review of payment data and supporting documentation to ascertain the that committed levels of DBE participation are met.

- DBE utilization reports and review Prime contractors DBE utilization plan/commitment.
- Prompt payment procedures / DBE Pay within 45 days
- One on One interview with DBE firms to determine Status of the job.
- Work to support the DBE firms and ensure that they are advancing according to the budget and schedule.
- Interview majority Contractors, Architects, Suppliers and Engineers to identify potential areas of disputes before problems arise.
- Provide a scope close-out report on all scopes DBEs self-performed to ensure that any changes in the scope have been accounted.
- Changes and change orders that do not alter the type of trades originally required but simply increase the amount of work required may be accomplished by using the existing DBEs under contract. (2005 needed only)
- All DBE substitution changes should be in writing and Harmony given the opportunity to provide a list of "willing able ready" SMWBEs to perform the task(s).
- Investigate allegations of unfair treatment of DBEs
- Mediate disputes and act as a liaison between DBEs, lead contractor, major subcontractors

<u>Paratus Group</u> – Firm received a bid bond offer of \$312,000 for Knoxville School project from Viking Bonding. Firm's Previous bonding capacity was \$250,000.
