New Business Item 1 - Brewer Drive

- A) Rescind all-way stop at Brewer Drive and Westcrest Drive
- B) Approve all-way stop at Brewer Drive and Southcrest Drive



Analysis

At the May 14, 2012 meeting of the Traffic and Parking Commission, it was decided to approve the appeal of the denial regarding the installation of an all-way stop at Brewer Drive and Westcrest Drive. However, after meeting on site with Council Member Blalock, it was decided that an all-way stop at that location would not be in the best interest of motorists as there are vertical curve concerns.

The intersection of Brewer Drive and Southcrest Drive was reviewed for the feasibility of installation of an all-way stop control. The geometric conditions at the Southcrest Drive intersection are more favorable for an all-way stop than at the intersection at Westcrest. The traffic data at the two intersections are similar – with the exception that the Southcrest Drive intersection is a three-leg approach versus the four-leg approach at Westcrest Drive.

Recommendation

Rescind the approval of the all-way stop of Brewer Drive and Westcrest Drive and approve the installation of an all-way stop at the intersection of Brewer Drive and Southcrest Drive.

DISCUSSION:

The Commission granted this request for this event in 2010. The request is for 40 spaces June 29 thru July 2, 100 spaces July 3, 350 spaces for July 4 and 40 spaces for July 5, 2011

According to the contract with the Nashville Downtown Partnership Section 8.H. no free parking or complimentary parking privileges shall be provided in the Parking Facilities but the regular charge shall be made to all persons, firms, corporations and organizations for the use of the parking spaces except as may be authorized by the Commission.
