# **OTHER BUSINESS**

1. Overview of residential permit parking process; Diane Marshall, Metro Public Works

Diane Marshall, Metro Public Works, gave overview of the Traffic and Parking Code 12.42.030 and 12.42.040 for Metro Nashville. She explained the process that is followed to obtain a residential permit parking permit. There was a question and answer session between the Commissioners, Metro Public Works and Teresa Costonis of Metro Legal to get clear understanding of this process and how it works.

A resident of the 12 South neighborhoods was present to speak regarding residential parking in his area. He stated that they experience problems on the weekends when Air BNB visitors are staying in the area. He feels there are not a lot of traffic policies in the city to help the residents. He stated that the fines are not enough for the violation.

Commissioner Woods suggested that we find a way to increase the fine for parking violations to deter violators. The fines are too low.

Teresa Costonis, Metro Legal, stated that she will have complete information regarding parking fines at the next month meeting.

2. Chip Knauf notified the Commission that the November 11<sup>th</sup> meeting is on a holiday and the commission would need to decide on an alternate date. Diane Marshall stated that a request had been submitted for meeting date of November 18. The commissioners will be notified of a date and

time. In addition, the vote for the Commission Chair and Vice-Chair will be in November as well.
