### **CALL TO ORDER**

Chairman John Green mentioned ordinance No. BL2006-1050 regarding the appeals process of the Traffic and Parking Commission.

"If you are not satisfied with a decision made by the Traffic & Parking Commission, you may appeal the decision by filing for a writ of certiorari with the Davidson County Chancery or Circuit Court. Your appeal must be filed within 60 days of the date of the entry of the Commission's decision. We advise that you seek your own independent legal advice to ensure that your appeal is filed in a timely manner and that all procedural requirements have been met."

### **APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

Sara Lee Woods moved for approval of the November 08,2021 agenda, seconded by Officer James Williams. Agenda was approved with no opposition.

## **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

Feller Brown moved for approval of the October 11, 2021 minutes and seconded by Officer Williams. The minutes were approved with no opposition.

#### **RESOLUTION 21-11**

- a) Speed Limit Change: A request for the reduction of the speed limit on McGavock Pike from Maplecrest Dr to Pennington Bend Rd from 40 mph to 35 mph. SR 1454281; Requested by CM Syracuse. CD 15
- b) Authorize Loading Zone: A request to establish a passenger loading zone at 1517 Church St (Tribe and Play bars) Wed- Sat, 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. SR 1458473; Requested by business owner. CD 19
- c) Modify Parking Zone: A request to modify the existing Residential Permit Parking on Acklen Avenue (both sides, 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue S to 15<sup>th</sup> Avenue S) from 24 hours with 2 hour limit, to 24 hours with no limit. SR 1463896; requested by CM Cash. CD18
- d) Speed Limit Change: A request for the reduction of the speed limit on the following streets within the Carothers Farms neighborhood:
- On Carothers Road from Battle Road to Clement Street from 30 mph to 25 mph
- On Grace Point Road from Clement Street to Park Terrace Lane from 30 mph to 25 mph
- On Winding Creek Dr from Fairchild Circle to Park Terrace Lane from 30 mph to 25 mph

SR 1424387; requested by resident. CD 33

Commissioner Woods moved for approval of the consent agenda and was seconded by Officer Williams. The motion was approved with no opposition.

#### **DEFFERED BUSINESS**

a) Parking Meter Removal: Authorize the removal of five (5) parking meters on the north side of Chet Atkins Place at 19<sup>th</sup> Avenue S, Requested by Hoar Construction. CD19

Beth Ostrowski, KCI Technology, speaking on behalf of the applicant, provided an overview of the site plan and how it relates to the request for parking removal. Specifically, some parking will be required to be removed if the garage driveway is to be accommodated. Jeff Hammond explained NDOT's position on the proposed configuration, which includes foregoing the proposed separate left turn lane in favor of trying to salvage some remaining active curb space along this block.

Ms. Ostrowski requested to withdraw the request and that no action be taken at this time. The applicant plans to work with NDOT staff to bring back a revised plan in the future. Commissioner Woods made a motion to withdrawal and the motion was seconded by Commissioner Mason. The motion was approved by the Commission.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Traffic and Parking Commission of the Metropolitan

Government of Nashville and Davidson County, Tennessee as follows:

SECTION I: That Chapter 12 of said Metropolitan Code, said Chapter being entitled 'Vehicles and Traffic' is amended as follows:

SECTION II. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution be published in a daily newspaper in Metropolitan Nashville/Davidson County, Tennessee, and that a certified copy be filed with the Chief of Police of the Metropolitan Police Department, and that a certified copy be filed with the Metropolitan clerk, and that said Resolution take effect five (5) days thereafter.
