

Monthly Board Brief, March 2022

Key Upcoming Priorities

1. <u>Donelson Branch Library Public Art (ACTION)</u> The citizen selection panel recommended two artists for the two public artwork sites. PAC voted to approve those artists during the March meeting.

2. <u>Grants and Funding</u>. FY23 Application final deadline is March 10. Grant panels have been set for May 2 & 4 with an alternate date of May 5.

3. <u>HR and Hiring</u>. In April, CARE will be reviewing job descriptions for two new positions under the Equity and Restorative Practices team.

4. <u>FY23 Budget.</u> Budget improvement requests have been submitted for Fiscal Year 2023. A budget meeting with Metro Finance and the Mayor's office is scheduled Wednesday, March 30, from 3:00 PM-3:30 PM. Arts' Council budget hearing has not yet been scheduled.

5. <u>Percent for Public Art Program.</u> Due to rising costs, several contracted artists are experiencing significant budgetary issues pertaining to fabrication. Staff are working on developing a series of recommendations—which may include increasing project budgets and revising project scopes—for PAC and Commission to review in April.

6. <u>Public Art Policies.</u> Staff continue to work with Metro Legal, CARE and other Metro stakeholders to make updates and improvements to the Donated Artwork Policy and Temporary Art on Metro Property policy.

7. <u>Racial Equity.</u> Draft Equity Lens will be distributed to all Committee Chairs for engagement and completion; BIPOC Arts Administrators Event planned for March 2022; REAL Alumni Network event scheduled for May 18th with a book study on *How to Be an Inclusive Leader* by Jennifer Brown; New CARE members have been selected and onboarding is underway.

8. <u>Strategic Planning.</u> On pause while working through meeting logistics.

9. <u>Youth Programs.</u> POWER Youth Site Partners have been approved. Youth applications are currently open. DIAL interns have been selected with tentative host matches; Restorative Arts is ongoing. FY23 will be a reverification year and staff will be working on a transition/relaunch plan and FY24 Restorative Arts Guidelines.
