- The offices and facilities were closed due to the recent weather event. Additionally, Covid has impacted the regional and neighborhood community centers resulting in reduced operating hours until after the MLK holiday. Other Parks facilities have adjusted hours as well.
- We are still working to fill vacancies within the department.
- After school programs are operational.
- We are monitoring open gym times at community centers by limiting the numbers of participants and following Covid protocols.
- The petition for the renaming of Hadley Park has been submitted for the June 2022 Tennessee Historic Commission meeting. Public notice has been posted on our website.
- The petition for the removal of the Confederate Private Monument is currently under review at Metro Legal.
- Staff is working to gather the information requested for the next Working Committee meeting.
- The FY23 budget kickoff will begin in the next few weeks. We have been advised to submit budget improvement requests that are performance based and justified. It is expected that submissions show a two percent reduction scenario.
