VIII. NEW BUSINESS

06-22-02 Board to approve open range salary increase and cost of living salary increase, consistent with Metro employees for the Director of Parks as per the 2022-23 Metropolitan Government Pay Plan.

VIII. NEW BUSINESS (cont'd)

- 4Ward Entertainment requests approval of a name change for a fundraising event permitted as the "Music City Jubilee Festival" to the "Hot Chicken Music Festival". The event was approved as a Consent Agenda item in October 2021, and is scheduled for Saturday, July 30, 2022, at Walk of Fame Park.
- O6-22-04 Staff requests acceptance of a \$2,000.00 donation from Backfield in Motion. This donation is to be used for Community Center Youth Sports. There is no required match or other obligation by Parks associated with this donation.
- **06-22-05** Staff requests acceptance of a \$10,000.00 grant for improvements to Elizabeth Park from David P. Crabtree to Metro Parks and Recreation. There is no required match or other obligation by Parks associated with this grant.
- O6-22-06 Staff requests acceptance of a donation of artwork, "Pathway To A Higher Note". The artwork is a community participation sculpture created in partnership with local artist, Betty Turney-Turner, and was created in commemoration of Juneteenth. The Curb Center for Art, Enterprise, and Public Policy at Vanderbilt University seeks to donate the sculpture for public display on the grounds of Centennial Art Center. There is no required match or other obligation by Parks associated with this donation.
- O6-22-07 Adventure Science Center (ASC) requests approval, per current lease provision, to develop a rooftop deck. The Metro Historic Zoning Commission's preliminary assessment is that the proposed improvements conform to requirements of the local historic landmark ordinance. This building improvement does not increase the overall height of the building or impact views from Fort Negley.
- O6-22-08 Staff requests acceptance of an in-kind grant not to exceed \$1,571,441 from Friends of Warner Parks to fund the next phase of improvements in Warner Parks. This grant requires no match or other obligation from Metro Parks. No money will be sent to Metro Parks. All projects will be paid for directly by Friends of Warner Parks and coordinated with Metro Parks staff.
- **06-22-09** Friends of Warner Parks requests acceptance of a S.W.E.A.T. staffing grant for Fiscal Year 2023 in the amount of \$46,252.63. The grant will be distributed via quarterly reimbursements to Metro Parks as detailed below:

- **06-22-10** Friends of Warner Parks requests acceptance of a Staffing grant for Fiscal Year 2023 in the amount of \$62,080.27. The details are as follows:
 - FOWP Staffing salaries in the amount of \$60,180.27
 - Copier Rioch in the amount of \$1,900.00
