Point of Privilege

Pay Equity Study Update

Mr. Diamond, Dr. Wright, and Mr. Frederick updated the Board on the status of the Pay Equity Study. Mr. Diamond had explained that Mayor Cooper's proposed budget included funds for the study; that he expected approval by Metro Council; and engagement with Deloitte, the vendor conducting the study, would proceed at the onset of Fiscal Year 2023.

Presentation on the State of Behavioral Health in the MPHD

Angie Thompson provided an update on the Behavioral Health program (<u>Attachment I</u>). Chair Franklin thanked for her service, as she would be retiring in the near future.

Ms. Thompson invited Katina Beard, director of the Matthew Walker Comprehensive Health Center, to speak on the topic of behavioral health needs and impact, from the perspective of the Safety Net.

Update on Childhood Immunizations

Michelle Runnfeldt and Angelina Hooper provided an update on Childhood Immunizations (<u>Attachment</u> II).

Dr. Jahangir noted that the rates of childhood immunizations in Davidson County are higher than the state rates and praised the staff for their efforts.

Presentation from Health Equity

Stephanie Kang introduced the staff of the Health Equity bureau and provided an update on Health Equity (Attachment III).

Resolution Honoring Dr. Alex Jahangir

Chair Franklin read into the record the Resolution honoring Dr. Alex Jahangir, whose term on the Board of Health officially concludes July 9, 2022 (<u>Attachment IV</u>). Dr. Jahangir received a standing ovation from those in attendance and spoke briefly on his pride in the Department's accomplishments during the past five years, during which he also served as Vice-Chair from November 2018-September 2019, and Chair from October 2019-September 2021.

Dr. Wright referred to the update provided in the Board packet (<u>Attachment V</u>) and highlighted several elements.

Ms. Etherington asked for an update on the Department's response to the infant formula shortage. Lauren Cromer provided an explanation of efforts to abate the effects of the shortage over the last several months.
