



MNCO Monthly Outstanding Chief Responses

November 18, 2022

The following table tracks the Metro Nashville Police Department (MNPD)'s responses to Resolution Reports issued by the Community Oversight Board (COB), specifically highlighting those Reports for which the COB has not yet received a written response from the Chief of Police. Per the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the COB and MNPD, the Chief is obliged to review and provide a written response to a Resolution Report within 45 calendar days of receipt. Section IX.B. of the MOU reads:

“Upon receipt of a Resolution Report, the Chief of Police agrees to review and provide a written response thereto within forty five (45) calendar days. Such response should include, but should not be limited to, acceptance, partial acceptance, or nonacceptance of the findings and/or recommendations, a statement of reasons for the Department’s decision, and a description of actions taken by the Department in response to the Report, including any factual, legal, or policy issues affecting the Department’s decision-making processes.”

Overall, the Chief has not responded to 5 Resolution Reports from the Board. Of these 5, 2 have been awaiting a response for more than 45 days. See the below table and graph for more information.
