Staff requests approval of the Park Board to acquire 3136 Parthenon Avenue, a 0.26 acre property, currently owned by Volunteer Builders, to allow for a possible future expansion of the dog park, and to swap 3136 Parthenon for 3140 and a portion of 3138 Parthenon (to create an equally sized 0.26 Acre parcel).

XIV. REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR

Director Odom announced:

- The park system has been very busy, as usual. The 27th Annual Celebrate Nashville Cultural Festival was this past weekend (October 1st). The festival was very well attended. It's exciting to see all the diversity in Nashville, and the diverse cultures that call Nashville home. Please plan to attend the event next year if you did not get a chance to attend this year.
- We continue to work to fill vacancies across the department. We are working with both external organizations as well as collaborating with peer departments here in Metro and those endeavors look very favorable.
- As mentioned last month, we have started discussions with the Finance Department and Administration about the upcoming Capital Spending Plan. Once we have received the finalized roster of requests that will impact the department, we'll share with the board. A preliminary list has been submitted and again most of those requests on the list are deferred maintenance in nature to care for our aging park system. There are a few items on the preliminary list that address cost escalations for ongoing projects.
- We've received the Final Order from the Tennessee Historical Commission regarding the renaming of Hadley Park. The determination was that the renaming of the park is not covered under the Tennessee Heritage Protection Act. Therefore, the renaming is not under the authority of the Tennessee Historical Commission. The Parks Board's vote to rename the park stands. In essence the Parks Board has already renamed the park to Hadley-Lillard Park. The next step is going to be replacing signage. The revision to the naming policy states that if a park is renamed, the organization that requested the name change would be responsible for covering all associated costs. The details of this transaction will be discussed with the Council Office and Minority Caucus of Metro Council.

QUESTIONS/COMMENTS FOR THE DIRECTOR

- Ms. Scott-Barnes asked for an update regarding the hiring of The Assistant Director for Consolidated Maintenance position. Director Odom advised that the position was posted last week and will close on October 13, 2022. It is an open competitive position and all who are qualified and interested in the are encouraged to apply. We plan to work to fill the position quickly, Director Odom acknowledged our great Maintenance team and their staff for those who have stepped up and been supportive during this interim transition time.
