BOARD DEFERS STAFF REQUEST TO AMEND THE CURRENT LEASE AGREEMENT BETWEEN METRO PARKS AND THE NASHVILLE ZOO TO INCLUDE THE DONATED PARCEL.

The request to amend the current lease agreement between Metro Parks and the Nashville Zoo to include the donated parcel, pursuant to the acceptance of the donation of a 4.4-acre parcel of property adjacent to the Nashville Zoo for a parking garage (Parks Board agenda item 12-21-03, December 2021) was deferred indefinite.
