Upon motion of Mr. Haynes, seconded by Mr. Johnston, and discussion the Friends of Warner Parks' request to amend the S.W.E.A.T. staffing grant for Fiscal Year 2023 in the amount of \$44,707.05, to reflect changes in position titles and salaries due to changes recently made to Metro's M&R Worker classifications, was approved. The grant will be distributed via quarterly reimbursements to Metro Parks as detailed below.

- S.W.E.A.T. Seasonal Worker 7 (step five) in the amount of \$8,407.47
- S.W.E.A.T. Seasonal Worker 7 (step three & five) in the amount of \$36,299.58.

Friends of Warner Parks will reimburse grant total amounts exceeded due to hourly wage changes or COLA, etc. This grant does not require a match, nor any type of further fulfillment by Metro Parks.

Upon motion of Mr. DeLay, seconded by Mr. Johnston, and discussion an in-kind grant not to exceed \$10,400 from the Centennial Park Conservancy to fund the purchase an installation of flooring in the Parthenon Offices, was accepted. There is no required match or other obligation by Parks associated with this grant. The project will be paid for directly by the Centennial Park Conservancy.

Upon motion of Mr. Haynes, seconded by Mr. DeLay, and discussion an in-kind grant from the Friends of Shelby Park valued at approximately \$42,000 for the installation of a boardwalk on the Shelby Park Events Lawn Loop, was accepted. The boardwalk is necessary due to regular flooding in the area that makes the path impassible. There is no required match or other obligation by Parks associated with this grant. The project will be paid for directly by the Friends of Shelby Park.

XIII. REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR

Director Odom announced:

- We are in process of completing our FY2024 annual operating budget submission, the deadline is Friday, February 10th. Thank you to Chinita White for coordinating for our department and to the Senior staff for submitting their information in a timely manner.
- The FY2023 capital spending plan was deferred at last night's Metro Council meeting. The capital spending and the four percent supplemental plan are pending, which includes our capital items such as deferred maintenance items for upkeep of the park system. Also, a \$500,000 Four percent appropriation is tracking with the proposed appropriations.
- On February 17th Ms. Amos and Director Odom will attend the hearing at the Tennessee Historical Commission regarding the waiver to relocate the Confederate Private Monument from Centennial Park. Park Board members will be notified of the outcome as soon as the decision is made.

- Parks in collaboration with the Department of Emergency Communications and the Metro Nashville Police Department has started use of the What3Words App. This app is being used internationally and can be used on any electronic device to help locate lost or injured hikers. The app will be helpful on our paved greenways, primitive and remote trails. DEC workers will be able to locate lost or injured park visitors. Please take advantage of this app, it's the first of its kind here in our city.
- The previous five-year Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Fairground is expiring. We will begin working with the team at the Fairgrounds to renew the current maintenance MOU soon. As you all may recall Fair Park is not Parks property, however, we maintain this property in coordination with the Fairgrounds staff and board.
