THE FRIENDS OF GREEN HILLS PARK TO PRESENT ANNUAL UPDATE TO THE BOARD.

Ms. Georgeann Chapman, of the Friends of Green Hills Park, provided an annual update to the Parks Board. Ms. Chapman highlighted 2022 achievements, which included, landscape improvements (planted 21 new trees and 10 last year), the removal of toxic invasive plants, and the 2023 upcoming projects for the Friends of Green Hills Park during her presentation.

THE FRIENDS OF FORT NASHBOROUGH TO PRESENT ANNUAL UPDATE TO THE BOARD.

Ms. Ellen Taylor, President of the Friends of Fort Nashborough, provided an annual update to the Parks Board. Ms. Taylor explained Fort Nashborough is no longer a national landmark, the challenges of securing funding for finishing the Fort, and the Friends of Fort Nashborough's vision for transforming the Fort into an interpretative center during her presentation.

Mr. Anderson inquired about an estimated cost to finish the fort.

Ms. Taylor commented that the original price quoted by David Curry was \$1.5M, but there might be ways to cut costs.

Councilmember Hurt inquired about Ms. Taylor's expectation of phasing of the work.

Ms. Taylor commented that it would take \$1.5M or less for the completion of phase 2.

XIII. REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR

Director Odom announced:

- The park system sustained quite a bit of damage due to the weather event of Friday, March 3rd. Maintenance is still working to assess damages and is moving forward with repairs. Damages are also being tracked/recorded in the event there is a declaration by TEMA.
- The Tennessee Historical Commission denied the waiver to relocate the Private Confederate Monument located in Centennial Park. Board members had

already approved posting contextual signage near the monument. A draft of language for the sign has been submitted to the Metro Historical Commission. We hope to have their recommendations by April's meeting to share with the Board.

- Thank you for your support of our FY2024 Budget submission, we will continue to work with both the Mayor's Office and the Finance Department to refine the request as it moves forward to be included in the Mayor's Proposed Budget for FY2024.
- Wentworth-Caldwell Park encampment is scheduled for closure Wednesday, March 15th. Our staff has been working in collaboration with the Metro Homeless Impact Division and MNPD, we are looking forward to the closure of the encampment as people are being housed, so that we may begin a robust cleanup of the area.
- We have purchased two Sky Cop mobile surveillance units to support Park Police efforts in prevention and detection of criminal activity. The Sky Cop's will move throughout the park system particularly in highly active areas where routine instances of car burglaries and vandalism occur, as Park Police continue to work on mitigating those instances.

Mr. Johnston inquired about the size of the Sky Cop's.

Director Odom commented that they are mobile units that roll like trailers.

Councilmember Druffel inquired about an update on Brookmeade Park.

Mr. Phil Luckett provided an overview on the status of Brookmeade Park.

Councilmember Druffel inquired about an ETA for Brookmeade.

Director Odom commented that we look forward to getting the park back open for the community, but there is no ETA at this time.
