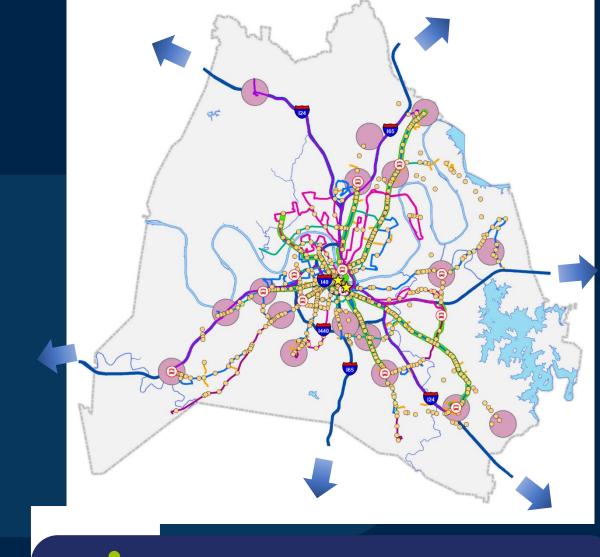

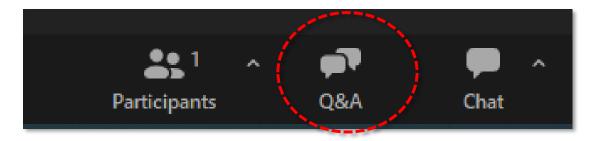

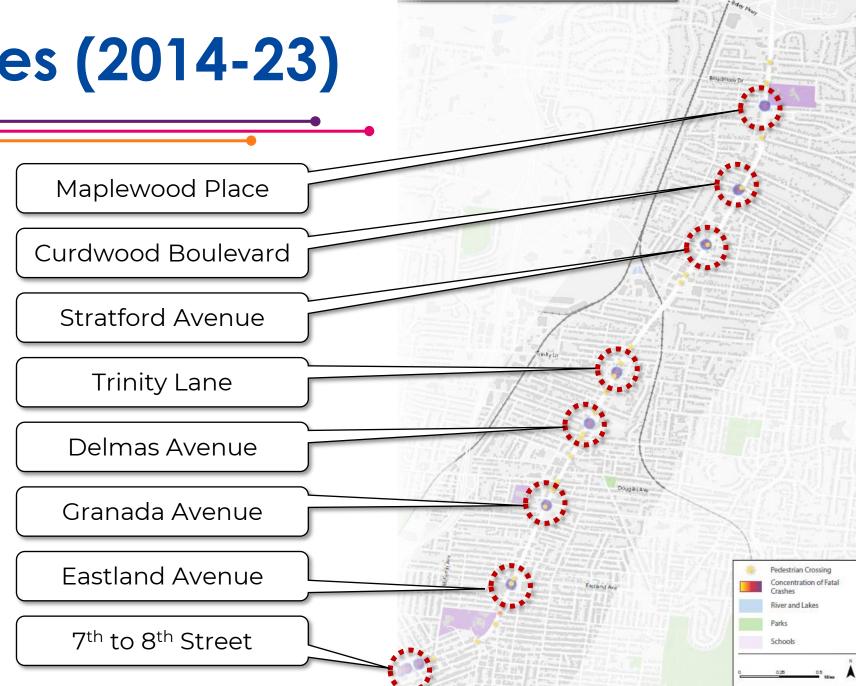
This project will set a vision to transform Main Street and Gallatin Pike into Complete Streets that provide safe and accessible options for all users and can be implemented in a cost-effective way.

Fatal crashes (2014-23)

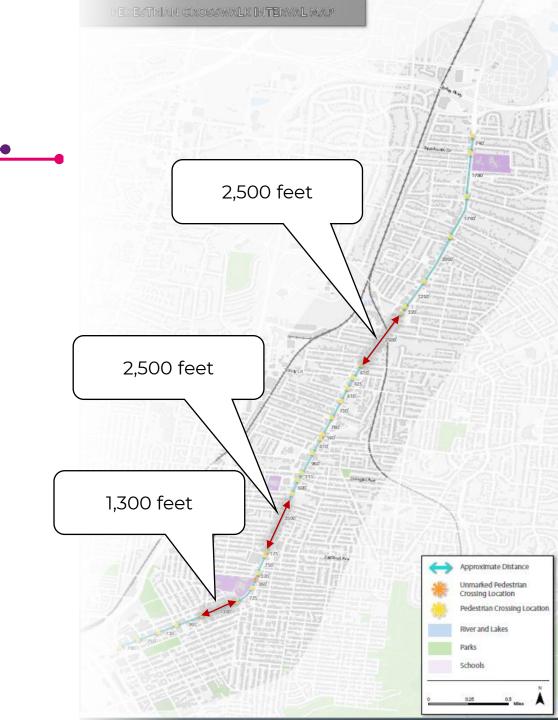
- 10 total deaths

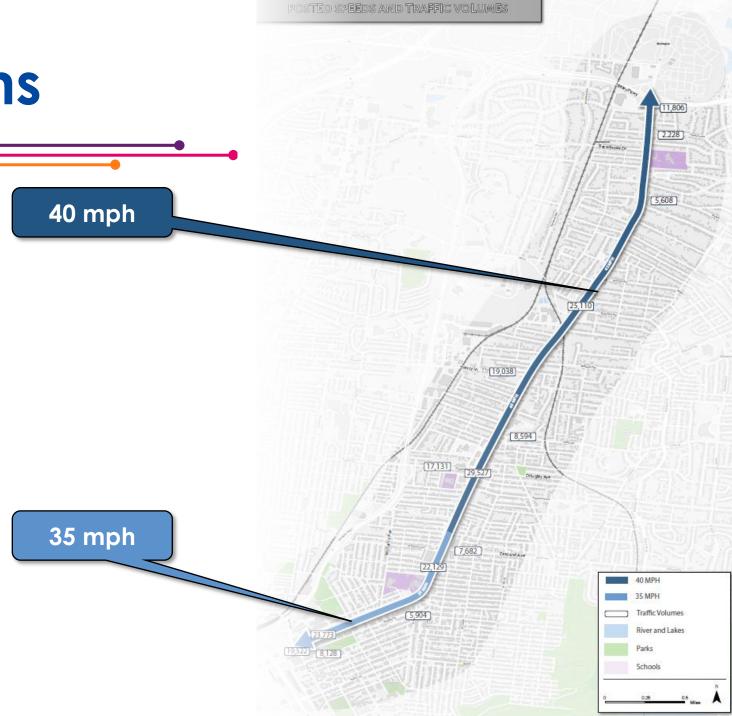

- Higher during off-peak hours







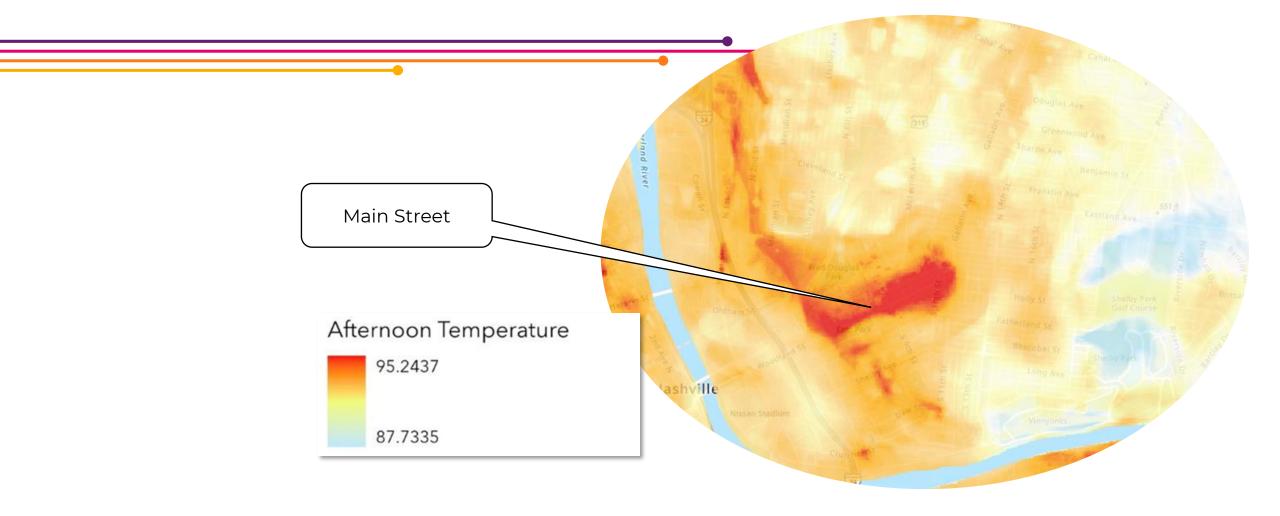
Uncomfortable roadside environment

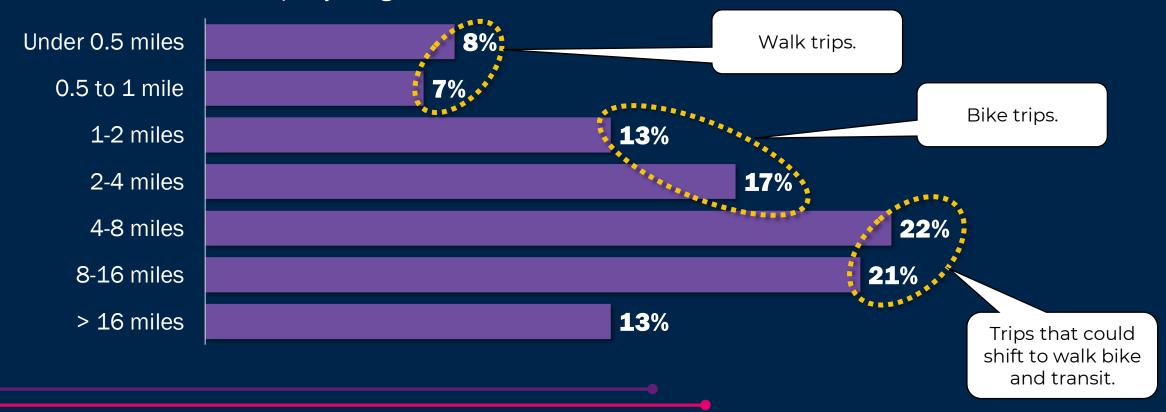

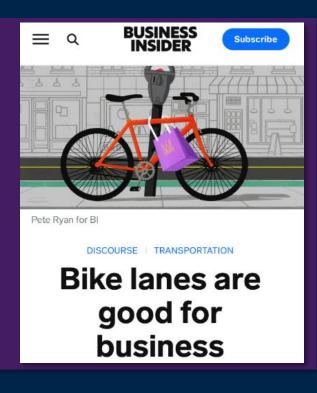
Trips by Length on Gallatin Pike and Main Street

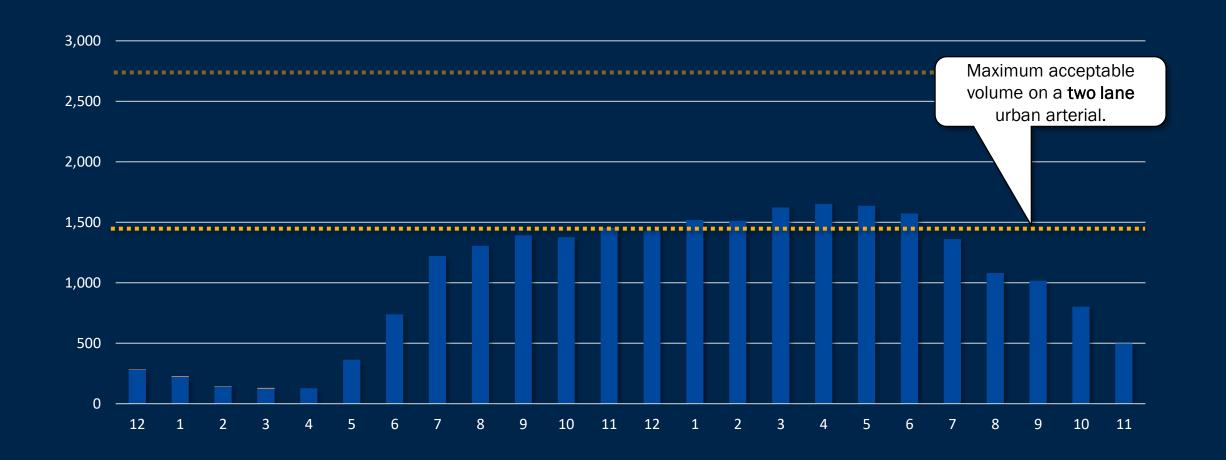


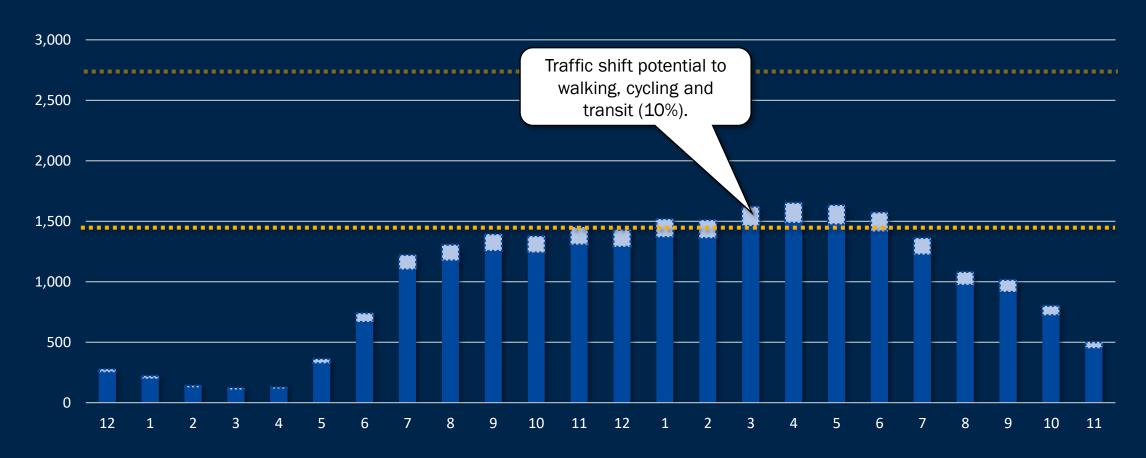


Maximum acceptable volume on a **four lane** urban arterial.

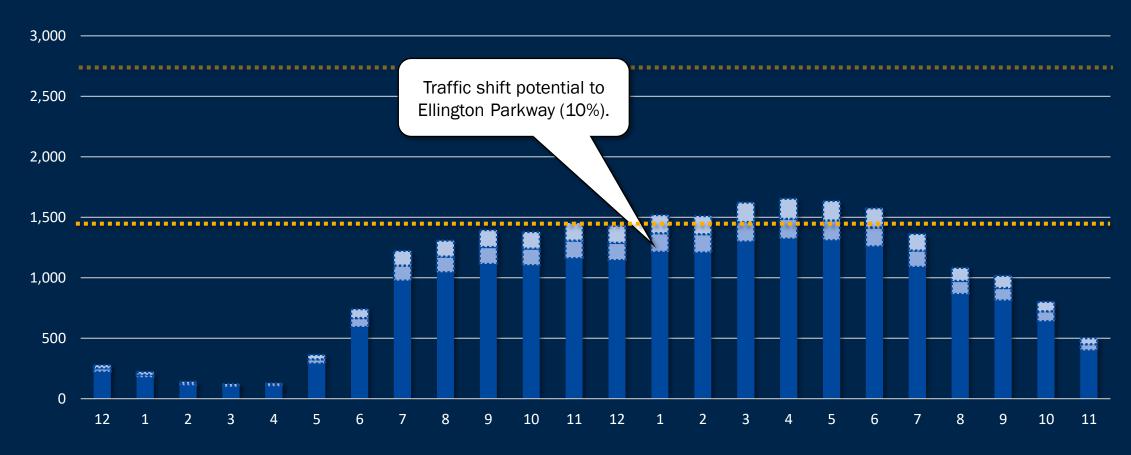












Gallatin Pike between Douglas Avenue and Trinity Lane, July 2023 (source: TDOT).

Service volumes from Florida DOT Generalized Level of Servicee Tables (2012).



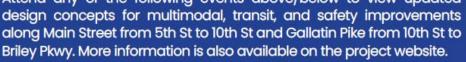
