BOARD DEFERS STAFF REQUEST TO AMEND THE CURRENT GREENWAY EASEMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN METRO PARKS AND THE DEVELOPERS OF A PROPOSED MULTI-FAMILY USE DEVELOPMENT TO BE LOCATED AT 2ND AVENUE NORTH AND VAN BUREN STREET TO, THE ACQUISITION COMMITTEE.

The requests to amend the current Greenway Easement Agreement between Metro Parks and the developers of a proposed multi-family use development to be located at 2nd Avenue North and Van Buren Street on Parcels 08205013400, 08205013900, 08205014000, and 08205013300 for realignment of the existing greenway trail, was deferred to the Acquisition Committee.

The Greenway currently runs east to west from 2nd Avenue North to 1st Avenue North, north of Van Buren Street and connecting to the existing Cumberland River Greenway in Germantown. 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XIV. REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR

- Mayor O’Connell recommended status quo baseline budget for all Metro departments. As well as a 1.4% savings target, which equates to about \$900,000 for our department.
- As a reminder our FY24 Budget Hearing with Metro Council is scheduled for May 23rd at 4:00 p.m. in the Metro Council Chambers.
- The Tennessee Historical Commission approved our waiver for the implementation of the Fort Negley Master Plan. Special thanks, to our Legal team Macy Amos and Tessa Ortiz-Marsh, and Jim Hester of our staff.
- Acknowledged the Parthenon’s staff for their “Museums for All Program” which offers free admission to the Parthenon to Snap and EBT Program participants. This program extends our reach and makes the Parthenon accessible to more visitors.
- Sign-ups for our Summer Enrichment Program have begun, there are currently a little over 1,900 youth registered. The Summer Enrichment Program runs from June 3rd through July 26th, there are currently a few vacant slots at Antioch, McFerrin, Morgan and Watkins Community Centers. This is an all-day summer program for youth from 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. to accommodate working parents.
- Paving of the cart paths at Ted Rhodes Golf Course has finally begun. We are excited to see this work in progress.
