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Summary

- 1) **Reported Crimes:** Major reported crimes increased 11.2% in Davidson County from 2022 to 2023. Violent crimes declined 1.7% while property crimes increased 15.4% (page 3).
- 2) **Arrests:** In 2023 adult physical arrests increased 23.2% above 2022. State Citation arrests also increased 29.0% above 2022 (page 4).
- 3) **Arrests by Gender:** males were 76.3% of physical arrests and females were 23.7% in 2023. Males were 70.0% of State Citations while females were 30.0% (page 4).
- 4) **Arrests by Race:** In 2023, Whites comprised 48.8% of physical arrests while Blacks comprised 49.9%. Whites were 59.3% of citation arrests and Blacks were 37.2% (page 6).
- 5) **Arrests by Ethnicity:** Hispanics were 12.6% and Non-Hispanics were 87.1% of physical arrests in 2023. Hispanics were 34.5% of citation arrests while Non-Hispanics made up 64.8% (page 7).
- 6) **Arrest Rates:** Davidson County had 2,832 physical arrests per 100,000 residents in 2023; State citations were issued at the rate of 920 per 100,000 residents (page 9).
- 7) **Bond Releases:** Overall, bond releases increased 15.6% in 2023. Releases to bonding companies were 46.9% of all bond types and increased 5.6%. Pretrial releases were 33.9% of bonds and increased 21.9% (page 10).
- 8) **Bond Set Amount:** The average bond amount set for all defendants in 2023 was \$9,672. The average bond amount for a felony defendant was \$25,504 and \$1,668 for a misdemeanor (page 11).
- 9) **Days In Jail Before Release:** In 2023, defendants spent an average of 5.54 days in jail before posting bond or case disposition. Felony defendants averaged 12.93 days and misdemeanants averaged 1.85 days in jail (page 12).
- 10) **Percent Who Posted Bond:** In 2023, 69.3% of all defendants posted bond before release. 33.5% used a bonding company and 25.0% received a pretrial release (pages 13-15).
- 11) **General Sessions Court Volume:** General Sessions Court processed 38.5% more defendants with a new filing in 2023 compared to 2022. General Sessions Court concluded 10.8% more defendants and bound over 17.6% more defendants to Criminal Court (pages 17-18).
- 12) **Criminal Court Volume:** Criminal Court processed 28.5% more defendants with new filings in 2023. There were 0.7% more defendants disposed. Criminal Court had 64.5% more defendants with probation violation filings but 0.9% fewer defendants with probation violations disposed in 2023 compared to 2022 (pages 19-20).
- 13) **General Sessions Case Processing Times:** On average, the time needed to process defendants in General Sessions Court in 2023 was 114.6 days, a decrease of 27.0% from 2022. Average time from arrest to bound over was 75.5 days, while arrest to disposition was 127.4 days. Jailed defendants averaged 17.4 days to conclusion. Bond defendants averaged 171.4 days to conclusion (pages 21-22).

- 14) **Criminal Court Case Processing Times:** In 2023 the average time to process defendants from bound over to filing in Criminal Court was 78.9 days, an increase of 5.9% from 2022. From filing to disposition in Criminal Court took 365.4 days on average, a 6.8% decrease. Cases disposed by trial averaged 960.2 days from filing to disposition in 2023. Jailed defendants took 265.8 days, while bond defendants took 430.9 days from filing in Criminal Court to disposition (pages 23-26).
- 15) **ADP:** The average daily inmate population in Davidson County correctional facilities increased from 1,699 in 2022 to 1,977 in 2023, a 16.4% increase (page 27).
- 16) **ADP by Gender:** Males comprised 89.6% of the ADP in 2023 while females made up 10.4% (page 28).
- 17) **ADP by Race:** By race, 38.7% of the 2023 ADP was White, and 60.0% was Black (page 29).
- 18) **ADP by Ethnicity:** 91.6% of the 2023 ADP was non-Hispanic; 8.3% were Hispanic (page 30).
- 19) **ADP by Age:** The median inmate age in 2023 was 34.4. The largest inmate age group was 21-44, representing 72.5% of the total inmate population (page 31).
- 20) **ADP by Charge Classification:** The largest inmate charge class in the 2023 ADP was Pretrial Felons, which comprised 48.2% of the total and increased 7.9% above 2022 levels. Locally Sentenced Felons were the second largest group, with 20.5% of the total ADP, and increased 13.9%. Other notable charge classes: Felony Probation Violators (7.7%), Convicted Misdemeanants (5.4%), Pretrial Misdemeanants (6.5%). Federal Inmates (DHS/ICE and Other Federal) accounted for 3.5% of the total ADP, increasing 36.7% (pages 32-36).
- 21) **ADP by Most Serious Arrested Charge:** 48.3% of the 2023 ADP had an Offense Against Person as their most serious charge. This was the largest category and included Homicides, Assaults, Robberies, and Rapes. Aggravated Assault with a Deadly Weapon was the single largest arrested charge, accounting for 7.9% of the 2023 ADP. Inmates arrested for Property Offenses were 10.9% of the ADP. 18.3% of the ADP had Offenses Against Courts and Government (mostly parole and probation violations). Public Health and Safety Offenses (mainly drug charges) accounted for 16.6% of the inmates (page 37).
- 22) **Incarceration Rates:** Davidson County incarcerated 277.5 inmates (including locally sentenced felons) per 100,000 residents in 2023, more than Knox County at 254.5 and Rutherford County at 234.8, but fewer than Hamilton County at 292.5 and Shelby County at 403.7. When the locally sentenced felons are removed, Davidson County's incarceration rate drops to 220.7 for 2023 (page 38).
- 23) **Juveniles:** There were no juveniles incarcerated in the adult correctional system in 2023. As of July 2015, juveniles adjudicated as adults are housed with Juvenile Detention. There were 14 juveniles transferred to the adult system from Juvenile Court in 2023, a 33.3% decrease from 2022 (page 39).

TOTAL AND GENDER

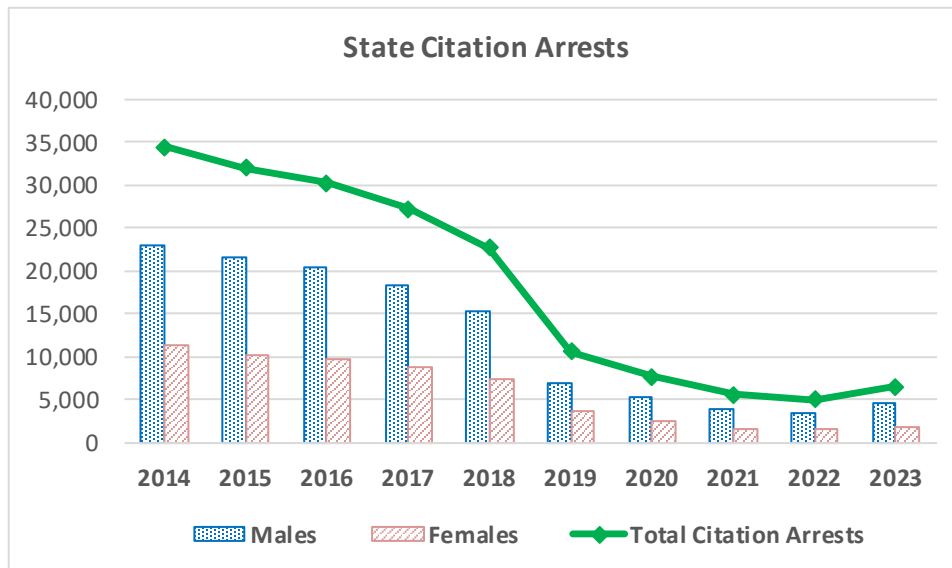
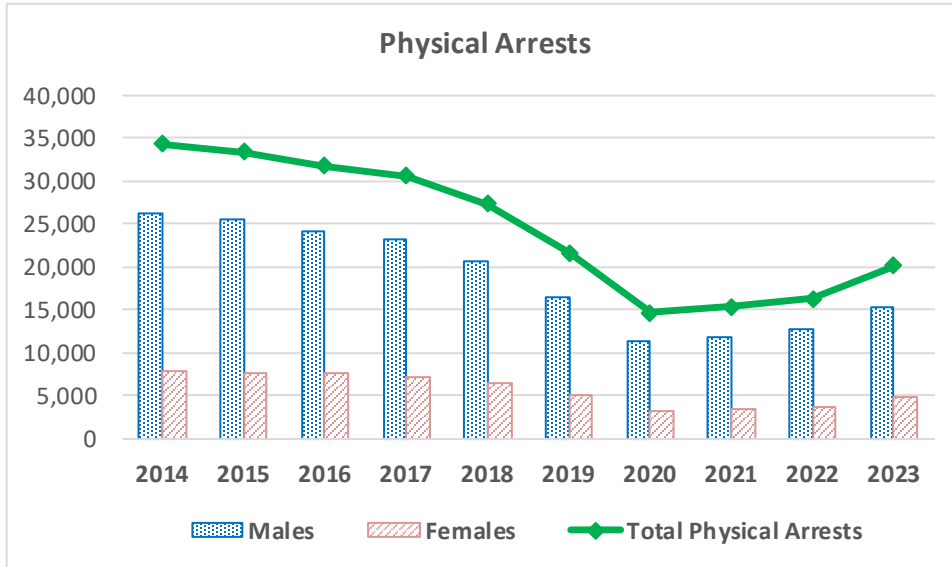

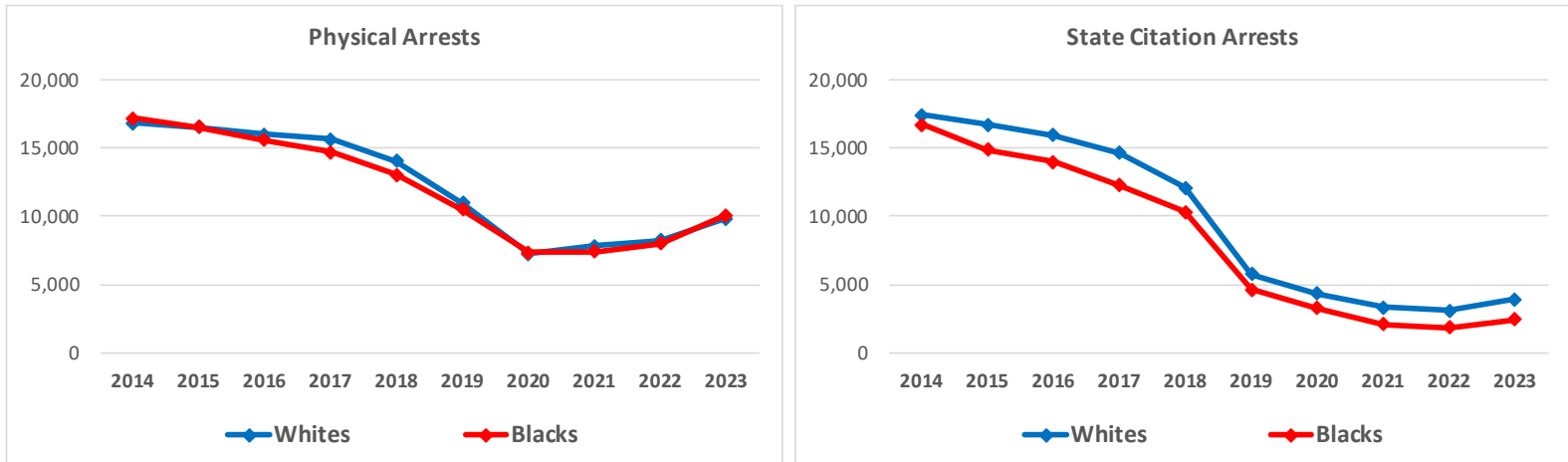

ETHNICITY

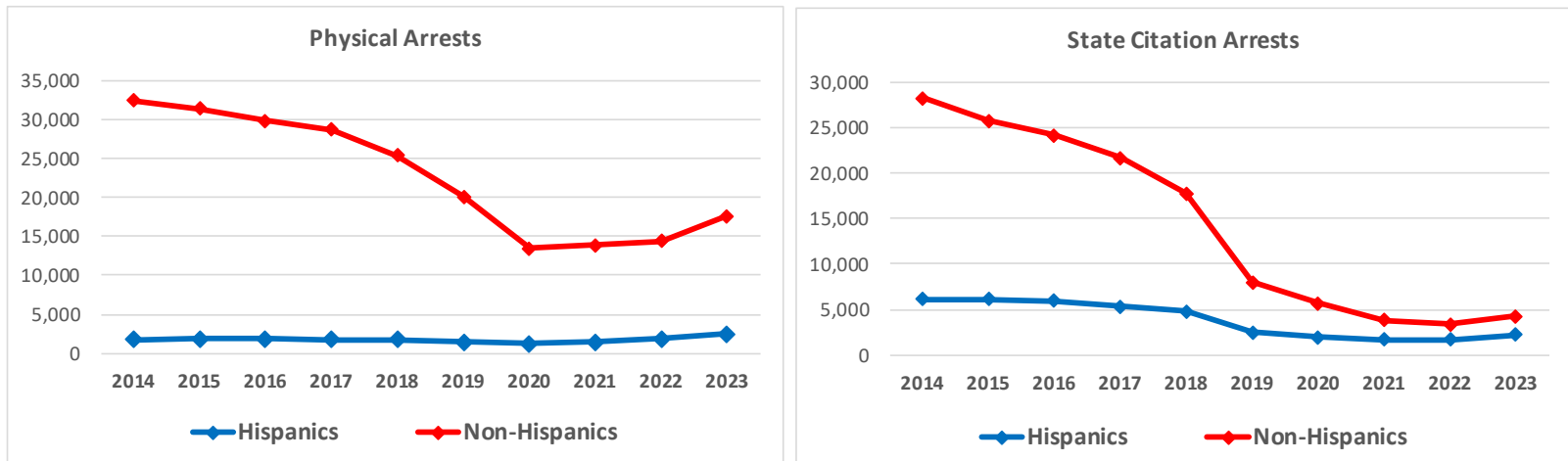

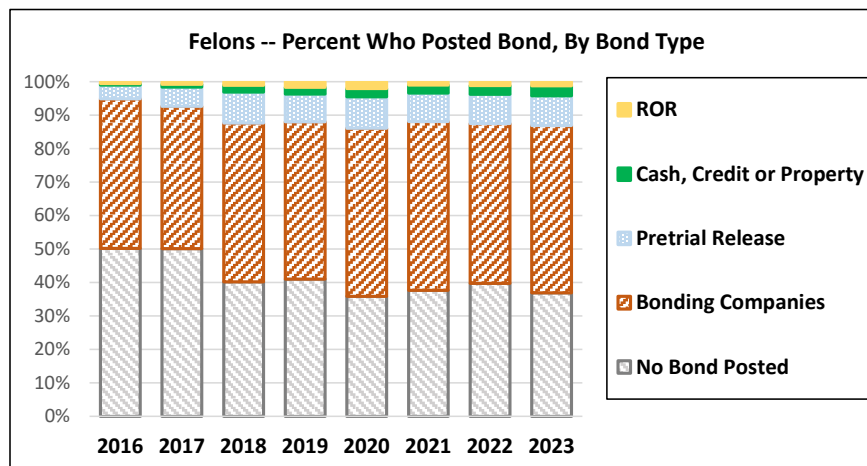

NOTES FOR TABLES 7-9:

- 1) Data includes all defendants with warrants on new cases filed in General Sessions Court. Felony and misdemeanor arrested charges are included. Each defendant represents a single person and all charges filed against that person at the time the person is taken into custody. Bond and case disposition data are accurate as of the date the data was pulled. Defendants with an incomplete bond status as of the data pull date are excluded from the analysis. Therefore, defendants in this report have either posted bond or had their charges disposed. Defendants bound over to Criminal Court are included only if they have posted bond or been disposed in Criminal Court.
- 2) The charge type (felony, misdemeanor) and charge classification are determined using the most serious arrested charge for the defendant at case filing date. Civil charges are included in the total but excluded in the detail lists.
- 3) Bond information is determined using Bond Set, Bond Reset, and Bond Post events and bond payment tables in CJIS.
- 4) Bond Set: Monetary bond amounts are at the defendant level. Bond set amounts are the sum of all bonds set for all charges pending when the defendant is brought into custody. The bond amount set is the amount that is forfeited if the defendant fails to appear in court or to comply with the conditions of the bond. In situations where the bond amount is reset than the reset amount is used in this report.
- 5) Bond Post: In Davidson County, after a defendant is arrested and brought to custody a commissioner sets a bail bond amount. Once the bond is set, the accused can pay the cash amount, obtain a property bond, get released to the Pretrial program, get released on their own recognizance (ROR), or hire a professional bond company (surety bond).
- 6) No Bond Posted: The defendant's charges were disposed, and no bond was posted prior to disposition. A small number were released prior to disposition without posting bond at the discretion of the court.
- 7) Days in Jail: Calculated using the number of days in jail from case filing to jail release upon posting bond. If no bond was posted, we used the number of days in jail from case filing to case disposition. If the defendant was bound over to Criminal Court, jail days included all days from case filing in General Sessions Court up to bond posting or disposition while in Criminal Court.
- 8) Statistics on bond amounts and jail days were calculated using values within 2 standard deviations + or - the mean to remove extreme values. Two standard deviations around the mean account for approximately 95% of the data population.

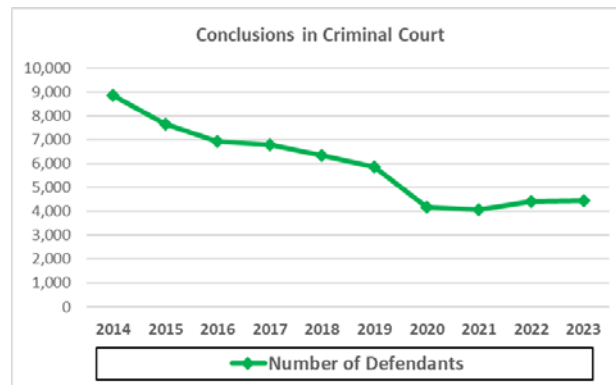

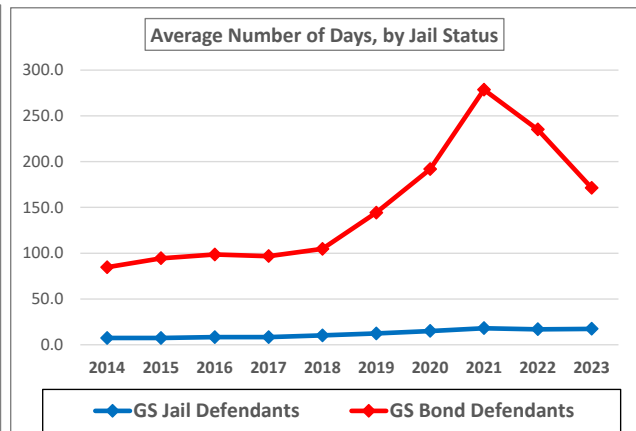

CASE PROCESSING TIMES IN CRIMINAL COURT 2014 – 2023

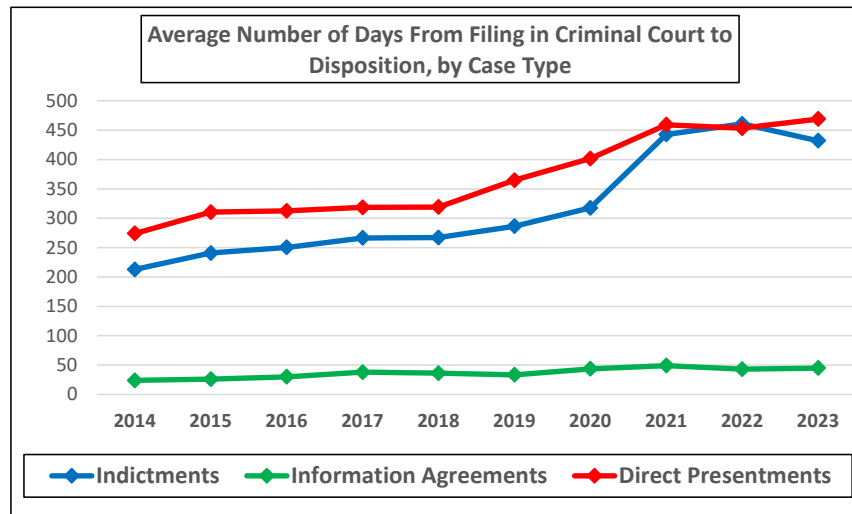
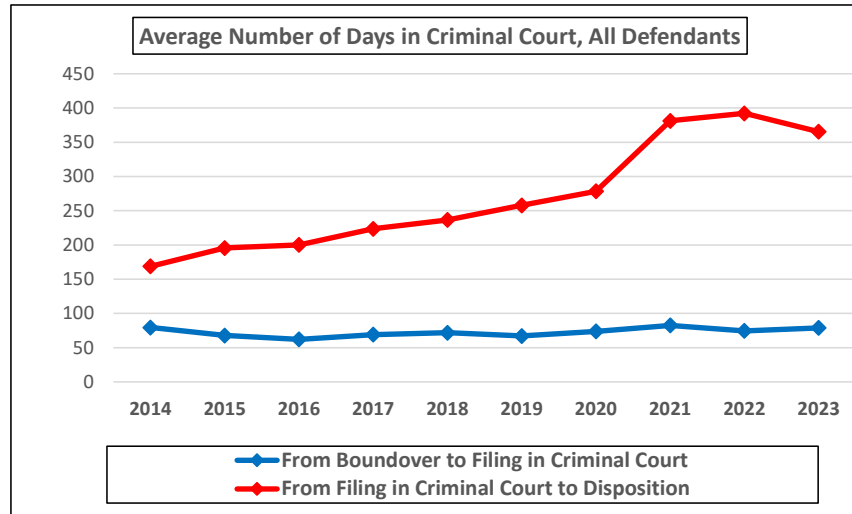

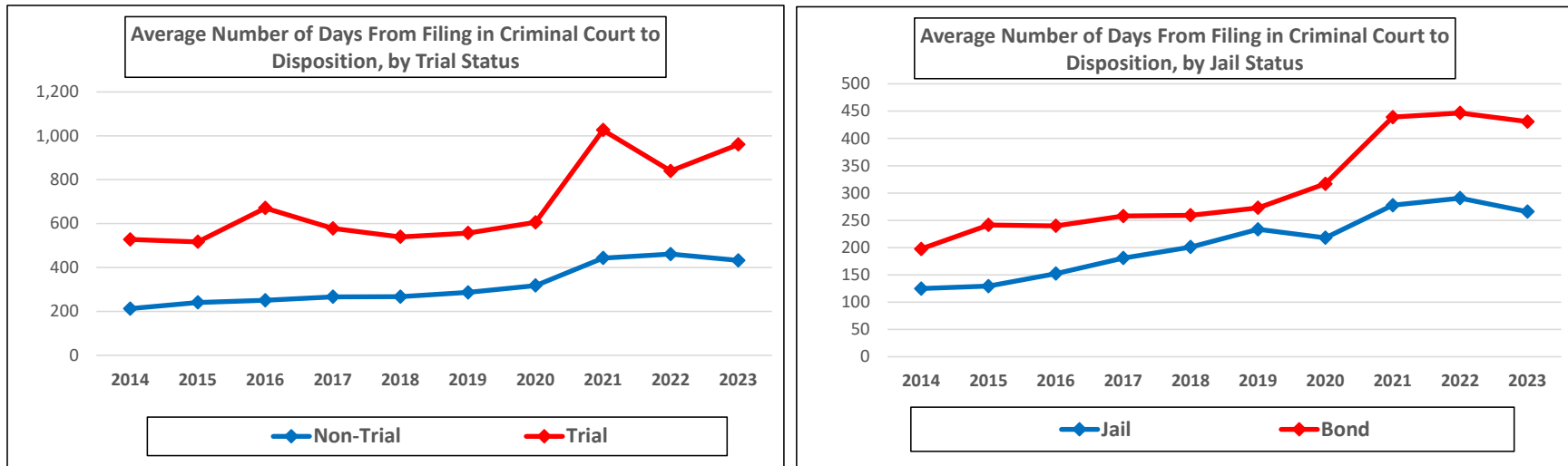

CASE PROCESSING TIMES IN CRIMINAL COURT 2014 – 2023



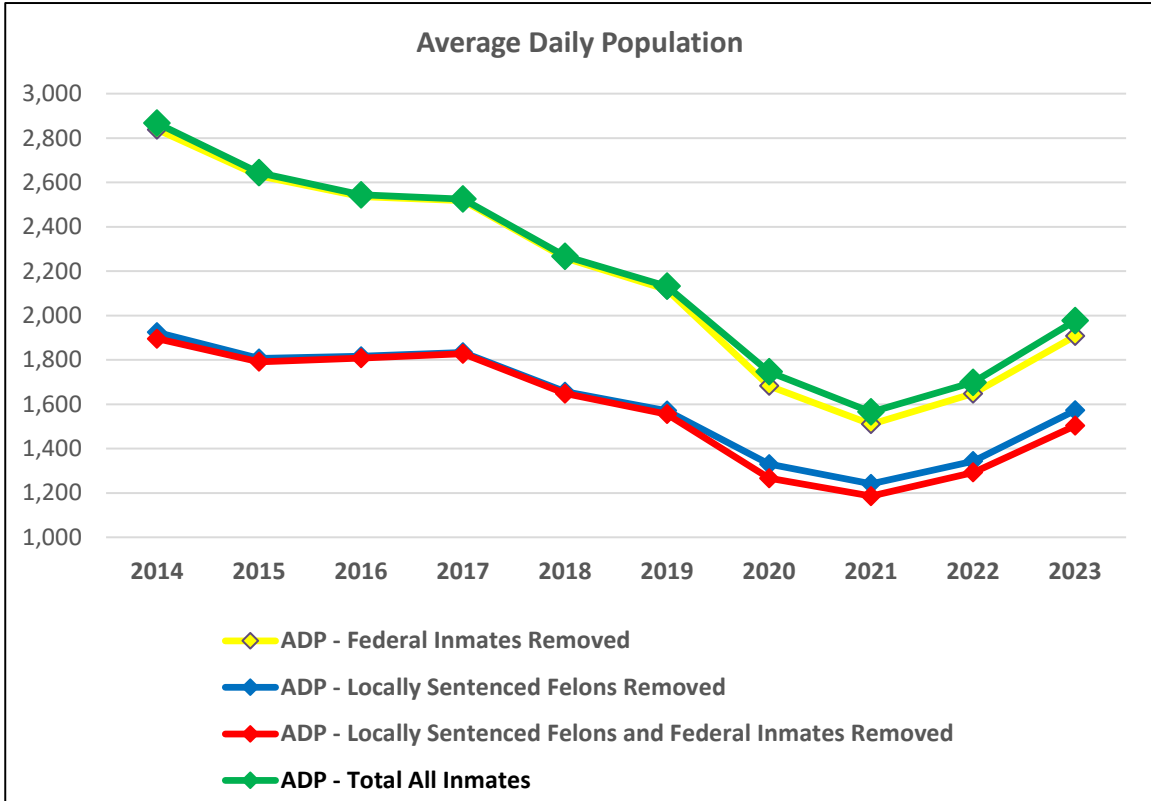

Direct Presentments occur when a case goes directly to the Grand Jury either by a sealed indictment or when a General Session Judge dismisses a case and the District Attorney's Office decides to continue to prosecute the case; the Grand Jury then determines there is probable cause that the person committed the crime.
- (c) The number of days is calculated from: (1) the date the case was bound over from General Sessions Court to the date the case was filed in Criminal Court, and (2) the date the case was filed in Criminal Court to the date of final disposition. Final disposition is the date the defendant receives a final disposition of all counts of a case. Averages were calculated using values that fell within 2 standard deviations from the mean, to exclude extreme values. Two standard deviations account for approximately 95% of the data.
- (d) Trial Status is defined as Trial when the case was recorded in CJIS as disposed with disposition by either jury trial or bench trial.
- (e) Jail status is determined by counting the number of days the defendant spent in custody until the charges were disposed. Jail status is defined as Jail when a defendant was incarcerated the majority of days (>50%) from filing to disposition in Criminal Court.
