## VII. OLD BUSINESS

- 08-24-02** Boyle Investment Company d/b/a Capitol View, requests acceptance of a proposed mural for the dog park at Frankie Pierce Park valued at approximately \$5,000. The mural, intended to enhance the aesthetic appeal and community atmosphere of the park, must receive prior approval from the Parks Department before any work begins. Additionally, the Parks Department will retain the authority to remove the mural if it is deemed necessary in the future. This measure ensures that the artwork aligns with park standards and community expectations while maintaining the flexibility to address any concerns that may arise. All cost and maintenance for the mural will be paid for directly by Capitol View. There is no required match or other obligation by Metro Parks. Council District 19

- 08-24-11** The Indigenous Peoples Coalition requests approval to rename Cumberland Park to “Wasioto Park”, the original Shawnee name of the Cumberland River. Council District 19
- 08-24-13** Staff requests approval of a dedicated Conservation Greenway Easement on property at 1231 Pawnee Trail, Parcel # 05300001900, overlooking the Cumberland River. This greenway easement will conserve 1.97 acres of open space and provide for future expansion of the Cumberland River Greenway. The easement dedication was a condition of Metro Council’s approval of Preliminary 2023SP-036-001 for a new residential development. Council District 9
- 08-24-14** Staff requests approval of a dedicated Conservation Greenway Easement along Trace Creek, located at 8033 Highway 100 on Parcel #15600003300, for a future connection to the Harpeth River Greenway. Dedication of the easement was conditioned by Metro Council’s approval of Preliminary 2022SP-041-002 for a new commercial development. Council District 35
- 08-24-15** Staff requests approval of a dedicated Conservation Greenway Easement and Participation Agreement for a new segment of the Whites Creek Greenway located at 4267 Ashland City Highway on Parcel # 069060C04500CO. Dedication of the easement was conditioned by Metro Council’s approval of Preliminary 2018SP-057-001 for a new residential development. Council District 1

## IX. NEW BUSINESS

- 09-24-02**      The Hillsboro-West End Neighborhood Association (HWEN) requests acceptance of a grant not to exceed \$20,000 for the 2024 annual maintenance and repair costs of the mosaic “Sea Serpent” sculpture (commonly referred to as “the dragon”) at Fannie Mae Dees Park (2400 Blakemore Avenue).

**IX. NEW BUSINESS (cont'd)**

There is no required match by Metro Parks associated with this grant. HWEN Association will provide Metro Parks with the cash grant to pay the vendor Art Up Nashville for services rendered. Council District 18

- 09-24-03** Staff requests approval for submission and ultimate acceptance of the Transportation Alternatives Program grant for the construction of the Opry Mills Greenways Connector, a vital link between the Stones River Greenway and the Cumberland River Greenway to the Opry Mills entertainment, retail, and hospitality campus. The grant will fund up to 80% of the construction costs. The estimated cost of construction is \$14,704,000. Greenways intends to apply for 70% of construction costs, \$10,292,800, with Metro providing a 30% match of \$4,411,200. There will be an estimated \$2,205,600 additional cost for CEI which is not eligible for grant funds. Council District 15.
- 09-24-04** Staff in partnership with the Metro Arts Commission and Creative Girls Rock, requests approval to add a mural at Z. Alexander Looby Community Center. The Public Art project is an initiative developed through the Mayor's Participatory Budget program for community development in North Nashville and will be supplemented with Percent for Arts funds. There is no cost to the department. Once installed and accepted, the work is property of the city, in the Public Art Collection, managed by the Metro Collections Manager. Metro Arts has 4% funds to cover all maintenance needs for the mural. Council District 2
- 09-24-05** Colby's Army Street Outreach requests permission to be onsite at Richland Park on Tuesdays between 1:00 pm and 3:00 pm to provide outreach resources for the unhoused community. Outreach would include packaged food, water, canned goods, clothing, and toiletries. Colby's Army encourages unhoused residents to begin the housing process and connects them with navigators and other mental health and social services. Council District 24
- 09-24-06** Ms. Jenny Hannon, President Friends of Warner Parks requests to address the Board regarding the "Belle Meade Highlands Study". Council District 34
- 09-24-07** Parks Board to consider Parking Agreement between Metro Parks and Cheekwood Botanical Gardens and Museum of Art (09-18-05). Council District 34
- 09-24-08** Parks Board to consider the 30-day suspension of Mr. Michael Poindexter from all Metro Parks and Recreation Centers (Park Policy 3000.24). Council District City Wide

This greenway easement will conserve 0.37 acres of open space and provide for future expansion of the Cumberland River Greenway network. The easement dedication was a condition of Metro Council's approval of Preliminary 2022SP-047-001 for a new residential development. Council District 15
- 09-24-10** Staff requests approval of a dedicated Conservation Greenway Easement on property at 0 Maxwell Road, Parcel #17600004900. This greenway easement will conserve 1.86 acres of open space and provide for future expansion of the Hurricane Creek Greenway. The easement dedication is provided via the Metropolitan Subdivision Regulations. Council District 8
