An Animal Shelter is a place for animals to live who don't have a home.




I will enter the shelter through the front doors.

There might be lots of people and animals in the lobby.




I will see a desk with people at it who can help answer questions.



Some people work here to take care of the animals. I know who works at MACC because they wear a shirt that says "STAFF"




Different doors in the lobby will take me to different places I might want to go.




Some doors will take me to see cats.




Some doors lead to the bathrooms.




Some doors will take me to see dogs.

The room might smell unpleasant.




I can walk through the aisles of the dog adoption rooms, the dogs might be barking or jumping.




I will keep my fingers outside of the kennels.

There will be cats of all ages and colors in the room.




I can look at the cats in their kennels but I shouldn't touch them.
